1. Tawang Festival

Why in News?

The 7th edition of the Tawang Festival concluded in Arunachal Pradesh. Tawang festival is a three day fest with varied traditional activities and events.

- The name Tawang came to the festival after the name of a hill station Tawang in Arunachal Pradesh.
- It celebrates Arunachal's rich cultural heritage, which includes Buddhist religious functions, traditional dances, indigenous sports, films and documentaries, food festivals.
- The major attractions in the festival are Dance of Yak, tribal participation with various dances and traditional monastic dances and **Aji-Lhamu** dance.
- Tawang hill station is home to several tribes and the major tribal community is Monpas.
- Tawang festival processions starts with a religious tradition known as Sebang.
 - It is a religious tradition in which the monks of Tawang town move to the festival spot in rallies from the Tawang monastery.

2. <u>550th Birth Anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji</u> Why in News?

12 November 2019, marks the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji-the founder of the Sikh religion. The occasion is celebrated as Gurupurab.

• Kartarpur corridor, across the international border between India and Pakistan has been built to commemorate the birth anniversary.

About Guru Nanak Dev

- Born in 1469, Guru Nanak Dev Ji is the first Guru of Sikhs.
- He advocated **nirguna bhakti i.e., worshipping a formless God** and universal brotherhood, love, humility, simplicity, equality and tolerance. His three important precepts are:
 - Contemplation of one god (nam-japna)
 - Earning one's livelihood (kirat karna)
 - Sharing one's earnings with others (vand chhakna)
- These principles act as a guide to live life with a high sense of purpose.
- He condemned the pretentious nature of religion with all its religious rites, ceremonies, sacrifices, pilgrimages, idol-worship and ascetic practices.
- Guru Nanak Dev initiated institutions like **Sangat** (*congregation*) and **Pangat** (*people sitting in row*) to vanquish institutionalised inequality and caste exclusiveness which continues to impact the social, religious, political and economic fabric of Indian society.
- He was succeeded by Guru Angad Dev.





Kartarpur Corridor

- India and Pakistan have signed a landmark agreement to operationalise the historic Kartarpur Corridor to allow Indian Sikh pilgrims to visit the holy Darbar Sahib in Pakistan.
- Daily 5000 Indan pilgrims will be allowed visa-free entry into Pakistan.
- Pilgrimages between India and Pakistan are governed by the 1974 Protocol on Visits to Religious Shrines, which includes a list of shrines in Pakistan and India open for visitors from both countries.
- The Kartarpur Corridor connects the Darbar Sahib Gurdwara in Narowal district of Pakistan with the Dera Baba Nanak shrine in Gurdaspur district in India's Punjab province.
- The length of the corridor is about 4 km, 2 km on either side of the international border.

Darbar Sahib Gurdwara, Kartarpur

- It is one of the holiest places for Sikhs where Baba Guru Nanak Dev Ji settled and preached for the last 18 years of his life.
- The Gurdwara is on the bank of the Ravi, in Kartarpur, Pakistan.
- It was his last resting place.

3. Fall of the Berlin Wall

Why in News?

- November 9th, 2019 marks the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall.
- It was a fortified barrier that stood from 1961 to 1989 separating West Berlin from East Berlin.
 - Berlin Wall not only represented the division between East and West Germany, but it was a symbol of the cold war separating the East and the West as a whole.

The Berlin Wall

- After the Second World War, Germany (and the city of Berlin) was divided into 4 occupation zones:
 - 1. USA

3. UK

2. France

- 4. USSR
- East Berlin (German Democratic Republic) was under USSR control, while West Berlin (Federal Republic of Germany) was under UK, USA, France.
- Construction of the wall started in 1961 to prevent the east German citizens from escaping to the west Germany via Berlin.
- It is part of the "Iron Curtain" which was the ideological conflict and physical boundary dividing Europe into two separate areas.





Fall of the Berlin Wall

- The Soviet Union had grown to be a large size where it became difficult to continue with state planning.
 - This resulted in failed policies, faulty industrialisation patterns, corrupt bureaucracy leading to severe economic crisis.
- The state controlled economic system did not provide incentives to encourage innovation and productivity.
- High expenditure in defense and neglect of other sectors led to rise in food prices and decline in wages.
- The closed market economy and coercive policies further damaged the crippling economy.
- In 1989, a series of radical political changes occurred in the Eastern Bloc, which challenged its authoritarian systems and led to liberalisation.
- Civil unrest across East and West Germany had put pressure on the East Germany administration to loosen some travel restrictions.
- After several weeks of civil unrest, the East German government announced on 9 November, 1989 that citizens could visit West Germany and West Berlin.
- This led to the collapse of the Berlin Wall.

4. Prophet Muhammad's Birthday

Why in News?

Recently, the birthday of Prophet Muhammad was celebrated on the ocassion of Milad-un-Nabi.

Prophet Muhammad and Origin of Islam

- Muhammad is traditionally said to have been born in 570 in Mecca (Saudi Arabia) and to have died in 632 in Medina (Saudi Arabia).
 - He is considered as Messenger of Allah (God) and the last Prophet of Islam.
- He was a deeply spiritual man, and often spent time in meditation on Mount Hira.
- Prophet Muhammad had divine revelations from Allah that became the basis for Quran and the foundation of Islam.
- Muhammad's popularity was seen as threatening by the people in power in Mecca, and Muhammad took his followers on a journey from Mecca to Medina in 622.
- This journey is called the **Hijrah** (migration) and the event was seen as so important for Islam that 622 is the year in which the Islamic calendar begins.
- Within ten years Muhammad had gained so many followers that he was able to return and conquer Mecca.
- From this time on, he was generally accepted by the faithful as the true final Prophet of God.





- Muhammad continued to lead his community both spiritually and in earthly matters until his death in 632.
- The word Islam means 'submission to the will of God'.
- There are five basic pillars of Islam:
 - o Declaration of faith
 - Praying five times a day
 - Giving money to charity
 - o Fasting
 - o A pilgrimage to Mecca

5. Thiruvalluvar

Why in News?

Recently, ancient poet-saint Thiruvalluvar has been in the news because of a political controversy in Tamil Nadu.

About Thiruvalluvar

- Thiruvalluvar was a Tamil poet-saint of the Sangam period.
- He is the author of the Tirukkural (Sacred Couplets), considered a masterpiece of human thought, compared in India and abroad to the Bible, John Milton's Paradise Lost, and the works of Plato.

Sangam Age

- The word 'Sangam' is the Tamil form of the Sanskrit word Sangha which means a group of persons or an association.
- Sangam age is a period of history of ancient Tamil Nadu and Kerala, named after the famous Sangam academies of poets and scholars centered in the city of Madurai.
