1. China Myanmar Economic Corridor

Why in News?

- China's President visited Myanmar to mark the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations.
- The visit focussed on the multiple projects under China- Myanmar Economic Corridor.

China-Myanmar Economic Corridor (CMEC)

- It is a number of infrastructure projects supporting connectivity between Myanmar and China.
- It is a branch of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) in the Indian Ocean.
- There are three core zones- Muse, Chinshwehaw and Kan Pite Tee envisaged at the border of both countries under it.
 - The core zones will be commercial areas with duty-free concessions, hotels, manufacturing, and financial services.
- It has three Pillars namely-
 - The Kyaukpyu Special Economic Zone
 - The China-Myanmar Border Economic Cooperation Zone
 - The New Yangon City

Impact on India

- China's economic stakes in the Bay of Bengal will signify larger maritime presence and naval engagement in the region which in turn reinforces the string of pearls policy by China.
 - The **String of Pearls** is a geopolitical theory referring to the network of Chinese military and commercial facilities extended from the Chinese mainland to Port Sudan in the Horn of Africa.
- This corridor signifies the economic as well as strategic rise of China in the Indian subcontinent.

2. <u>Raisina Dialogue</u>

Why in News?

The 5th edition of Raisina Dialogue is being held in New Delhi. The dialogue is organised by the Ministry of External Affairs and Observer Research Foundation.

Raisina Dialogue

- The conference is named after **"Raisina Hills"**, which is the seat of Government of India and Rashtrapati Bhavan.
- It is designed on the lines of Shangri-La dialogue.
- It is considered as India's flagship conference on geo-economics and geopolitics.





- The title of the Raisina Dialogue year (2020) is "**Navigating the** Alpha Century".
- It is considered as India's flagship conference on geo-economics and geopolitics.
- It aims at exploring opportunities of Asian integration.
- The Dialogue is structured as a multi-stakeholder, cross-sectoral discussion, involving heads of state, cabinet ministers and local government officials, as well as major private sector executives, members of the media and academics.
