Football for Schools (F4S) Programme

Why in News?

The Union Education Minister launched the Football for Schools (F4S) programme by distributing Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) footballs at PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalaya, Fort William, Kolkata.

Key Points

- About the Football for Schools (F4S) Programme:
 - ★ FIFA spearheads the F4S programme globally to make football accessible to students through school systems.
 - ★ In India, the Ministry of Education implements
 F4S through the Department of School
 Education and Literacy (DoSEL), with support
 from the All India Football Federation (AIFF)
 and the Sports Authority of India (SAI).
 - ★ As of January 2025, FIFA has committed over 9.6 lakh footballs to India and 129 other participating countries.
 - ★ The West Bengal rollout builds on successful state-level launches like Odisha in 2024, reinforcing India's push for grassroots sports culture.
- About PM-SHRI Scheme:
 - About:
 - The PM SHRI Scheme is a centrally sponsored initiative, launched in 2022, by the Government of India aimed at establishing over 14,500 PM SHRI Schools by enhancing existing schools to showcase the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

⋆ Objective:

The primary objective is to create an inclusive and nurturing environment that promotes the well-being and safety of every student, offering diverse learning experiences and access to quality infrastructure and resources.

Duration of Scheme:

The duration of the scheme is from 2022-23 to 2026-27, after which it shall be the responsibility of the states/UTs to continue to maintain the benchmarks achieved by these schools.

★ Schools Eligible to become PM SHRI School:

- Schools managed by Central/State/UT Governments and local bodies.
- All Kendriya Vidyalayas and Navodaya Vidyalayas which are non-project and run from permanent buildings.

★ Monitoring Framework of Schools:

- A School Quality Assessment Framework (SQAF) will monitor performance, with regular evaluations to ensure high standards.
- SQAF is a set of standards and best practices as paradigms for attaining individual and institutional excellence.

All India Football Federation (AIFF)

- The AIFF is the organization that manages the game of association football in India.
- It administers the running of the India national football team and also controls the I-League, India's premier domestic club competition, in addition to various other competitions and teams.
- The AIFF was founded in 1937, and gained FIFA affiliation in the year 1948, after India's independence in 1947.
- Currently, it has an office in Dwarka, New Delhi.

Doi Ghat Redevelopment Along Hooghly River

Why in News?

Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port (SMP), Kolkata, and TNS Logi-Park Pvt. Ltd. signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to redevelop the historic Doi (Dahi) Ghat under a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative, aiming to restore its cultural and economic legacy.

The Doi Ghat project aligns with SMP's broader initiative to develop and beautify the Hooghly riverfront for cultural revival and tourism.

Key Points

- Historical and Cultural Significance of Doi Ghat:
 - ★ Located at the confluence of Adi Ganga and the Hooghly River, opposite Howrah.
 - ★ The name "Doi Ghat" is derived from the Bengali word doi (curd), due to its historic link to the dairy trade from Howrah.
 - ★ It was a vital riverine trade and cultural exchange point between rural Bengal and colonial Calcutta.



Significance of the MoU:

- ★ Urban Heritage Conservation: Revives a forgotten socio-cultural landmark.
- Public-Private Partnership (PPP): Demonstrates successful collaboration for social development.
- Tourism and Community Engagement: Adds to riverfront aesthetics and fosters cultural pride.
- Sustainable Development: Integrates heritage, environment, and infrastructure goals.
- Alignment with Clean Ganga Mission: Supports the broader national objective of restoring sacred rivers.

About Adi Ganga:

- Known historically as Gobindapur Creek, Surman's Canal, and Tolly's Canal.
- ★ Served as the main course of the Hooghly River between the 15th and 17th centuries before silting and diversion.
- Currently a polluted urban water body; efforts are underway for its revival and rejuvenation, including:
 - National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) has sanctioned ₹650 crore.
 - Adi Ganga included in a multi-country South Asian river pollution combat project.

Hooghly River:

- ★ A 260 km distributary of the Ganga originating from Murshidabad.
- Formed when the Ganga splits into Padma (towards Bangladesh) and Hooghly (towards West Bengal).
- Known also as Bhagirathi-Hooghly or Kati-Ganga.
- Crucial for port trade, transport, cultural life, and religious activities in Bengal.

Calcutta Club Elects First Woman President

Why in News?

Calcutta Club, a prestigious social institution that opened its doors to individual women members only in 2007, has made history by electing its **first female president.**

Key Points

- About: Businesswoman Kasturi Raha triumphed in the club's election, defeating P.K. Mukherjee and Snehashish Bhaumik to claim the top position.
 - ★ Raha's election is a significant achievement as she becomes the first woman to lead the

- **club**, marking a pivotal moment in its centurylong history.
- ★ She had previously made history as the third woman to be granted independent membership at the Calcutta Club and was the first woman elected to its managing committee in 2013.
- Calcutta Club: Established in 1907, the club followed the tradition of London clubs, excluding women from membership.
 - ★ Women could only access the facilities as dependents of male members.
 - Special membership was granted to widows of male members, while NRI and corporate memberships were also restricted to men.

Discovery of New Spider and Parasitic Wasp Species

Why in News?

In a remarkable development, scientists from the **Zoological Survey of India (ZSI)** have announced the discovery of a new species of **wolf spider** and four new species of **spider-egg parasitic wasps** in the state of West Bengal, India.

Key Points

- About: The findings highlight the region's rich yet largely unexplored biodiversity and have been documented in recent publications in esteemed international journals.
 - ★ The discovery of both the Piratula acuminata spider and the Idris wasps underscores the importance of systematic taxonomy and molecular tools in unveiling India's hidden biodiversity.
- New species of wolf spider- *Piratula acuminata:*
 - → One of the standout discoveries is the identification of Piratula acuminata, a new species of wolf spider. This marks the first record of the genus Piratula in India.

- ★ The spider was found on Sagar Island, which is part of the ecologically sensitive <u>Sundarbans</u> <u>delta</u>—a region that is home to diverse wildlife and complex ecosystems.
- ★ The newly discovered spider belongs to the Lycosidae family, commonly known as wolf spiders.
- ✓ Unlike other spiders that weave webs, wolf spiders are known for their agile and nocturnal hunting skills. They are ambush predators, capturing prey with incredible precision and speed.
- ★ This medium-sized spider, measuring approximately 8 to 10 millimeters, is easily distinguished by its creamy-white body adorned with brown and chalk-white spots.
- ★ Its unique genital structures further set it apart as an undocumented species, signaling its novelty to the scientific community.
- Four New Species of Parasitoid Wasps- Idris:
 - ★ In a separate study, another group of ZSI researchers, led by K. Rajmohana, described four new species of parasitoid wasps belonging to the genus *Idris* (Hymenoptera: Scelionidae).
 - ★ These wasps, identified as Idris bianor, Idris furvus, Idris hyllus, and Idris longiscapus, were collected from agroecosystems and semi-natural habitats across West Bengal between 2021 and 2023.
 - Parasitoid wasps, especially those in the *Idris* genus, play an essential role in controlling spider populations.
 - ★ As primary egg parasitoids of jumping spiders (Salticidae), these wasps exhibit gregarious parasitism, where multiple wasps emerge from a single spider egg sac. This unusual behaviour highlights the fascinating and complex relationships within ecosystems.

Zoological Survey of India (ZSI)

- ZSI is a subordinate organization of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC) and was established in 1916 as a national center for the faunistic survey and exploration of the resources, leading to the advancement of knowledge on the exceptionally rich faunal diversity of the country.
- It has its headquarters at Kolkata and 16 regional stations located in different geographic locations of the country.

Hepatitis B Elimination Efforts in West Bengal

Why in News?

On <u>World Hepatitis Day</u>, health officials expressed optimism that Bengal, with a **0.07% Hepatitis B prevalence** among children under 5, is on track to meet the <u>World Health Organization's (WHO)</u> 0.1% target and eliminate the disease by **2030**.

The state is currently the only one to report such detailed data on <u>Hepatitis B</u> prevalence in children, with the national estimate pegged at 1.14%.

Key Points

About Hepatitis

- About: Viral hepatitis is an infection that causes liver inflammation, damage, and may lead to liver cancer.
 - ★ It is typically caused by hepatotropic viruses, including A, B, C, D, and E, although other viruses like the varicella virus can also lead to the disease.
 - SARS-CoV-2, the virus causing Covid-19 may injure the liver too.
 - Additional causes encompass drug and alcohol misuse, liver fat accumulation (fatty liver hepatitis), or an autoimmune response where the body produces antibodies targeting the liver (autoimmune hepatitis).

- Global Challenge: It is a major global public health challenge, ranking as one of the leading causes of death, with an estimated 1.3 million deaths in 2022, according to the WHO report.
 - ★ The top ten countries account for almost two-thirds of the global burden of viral hepatitis B and C combined.
 - ★ In 2022, China, India, and Indonesia alone accounted for 50% of the global hepatitis B burden, while China, India, Indonesia, Pakistan, the Russian Federation, and the USA represented 50% of the global hepatitis C burden.
- World Hepatitis Day: The world observes World Hepatitis Day on 28th July every year to promote global awareness of hepatitis prevention, early detection, and effective treatment options.

West Bengal's Health Department's Intervention Measures

- In recent years, the Bengal health department has implemented several key measures aimed at early intervention and prevention of Hepatitis B. These include:
 - * Screening of Pregnant Women: Ensuring that all pregnant mothers attending government health facilities are screened for Hepatitis B to prevent mother-to-child transmission.
 - ★ Vaccination at Birth: Administering the Hepatitis B vaccine to newborns at birth to protect them from the virus.
 - Immunoglobulin for Newborns: Providing immunoglobulin to babies born to mothers who are Hepatitis B carriers to prevent the virus from being transmitted.
 - ★ Project for Triple Elimination: Bengal has taken a pioneering step by launching a project for the triple elimination of Hepatitis, syphilis, and HIV.
 - Liver Foundation West Bengal: On World Hepatitis Day, the Liver Foundation West Bengal leveraged digital platforms to raise awareness about viral Hepatitis, reaching out to students across 23 schools in the state.
