Operation Naya Savera to Curb Human Trafficking

Why in News?

To mark World Day Against Trafficking in Persons (30th July), the Bihar Police Headquarters launched 'Operation Naya Savera', a major drive to rescue and rehabilitate trafficking victims, especially minors, from exploitative sectors.

The 2025 theme of World Day Against Trafficking in Persons is "Human trafficking is organised crime

 End the exploitation."

Key Facts Regarding Operation Naya Savera and Human Trafficking in Bihar

- About Operation Naya Savera: It is a fortnightlong campaign (31st July to 14th August 2025) that aims to rescue and rehabilitate victims of human.trafficking, child labour, flesh trade, and exploitation in orchestra groups.
 - ★ It is organised by the Weaker Sections Division of Bihar Police.
- Statistics on Trafficking in Bihar: From January to May 2025, a total of 231 human trafficking cases were registered in Bihar.
 - During this period, 118 minor girls and 506 boys were rescued, and 144 traffickers were arrested.
 - According to NCRB 2022, Bihar ranked third nationally in human trafficking cases with 260 cases, but it topped the country in the number of minors rescued.
- Anti-Trafficking Mechanism in Bihar:
 - ★ District-Level Mechanism: Each district has an Anti-Human Trafficking Committee and an Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force (AHTTF) which conducts raids and rescues based on confidential inputs.
 - In border areas, similar operations are carried out by the <u>Sashastra Seema Bal</u> (<u>SSB</u>).
 - Rehabilitation Process: Rescued victims are rehabilitated through Child Welfare Committees (CWC) and child care institutions.

- Challenges in Combating Trafficking: Proximity to borders aids traffickers' escape, while delayed information hampers rescues.
 - ★ Family non-cooperation and social stigma hinder rehabilitation and reintegration of survivors.
- Strategy to Enhance Anti-Trafficking Strategy: Bihar is deploying ground staff across roads and railways to trace victims and has strengthened coordination with NGOs, police, and welfare departments.
 - ★ It is also promoting community awareness, supporting survivor reintegration, and issuing Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) to guide police actions.

Bharat Ratna to Bhikhari Thakur

Why in News?

BJP MP Manoj Tiwari has urged Union Home Minister to posthumously award Bharat Ratna to Bhikhari Thakur, the legendary Bhojpuri poet, playwright, singer, and social reformer.

• The demand for Bharat Ratna to Bhikhari Thakur faces no political opposition in Bihar, reflecting broad cross-party respect for him.

Key Points Regarding Bhikhari Thakur

- About: Bhikhari Thakur, born in 1887 in Qutubpur Diara village, Saran district, Bihar, is often hailed as the "Shakespeare of Bhojpuri".
 - He later migrated to Calcutta (now Kolkata), where he keenly observed the struggles of migrant workers, which deeply influenced his work
- Literary Contributions: He authored 29 books, beginning with Batohiya in 1912.
 - ★ His most famous play, Bidesiya, highlights the pain of separation caused by migration.
 - Works like Beti Bechwa, Gabar Ghichor, and Achhoot Ki Shikayat addressed critical social issues such as child marriage, dowry, and untouchability.

- Achhoot Ki Shikayat is based on the life of Hira Dom, a Dalit character.
- Through his works, he addressed social issues such as child marriage, caste discrimination, gender inequality, alcoholism, and migration and displacement.
- Legacy: Bhikhari Thakur remains a symbol of Bhojpuri pride and Bihar's cultural legacy, with his theatre and music continuing to educate, inspire, and promote social reform through grassroots art.

Pratyaya Amrit: New Chief Secretary of Bihar

Why in News?

In a significant administrative shift, **Pratyaya Amrit**, a 1991 batch **IAS officer** from **Bihar**, has been appointed as the new **Chief Secretary of Bihar**, succeeding **Amrit Lal Meena**, who will retire on **31**st **August 2025**.

Pratyaya will officially assume charge on **1**st**September 2025**.

Key Points

- Pratyaya Amrit, currently serving as the Development Commissioner of Bihar, has been entrusted with the responsibility of Chief Secretary.
 - In addition, he holds the additional charge of Additional Chief Secretary for the Health and Disaster Management Departments.
- He was awarded the <u>Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration</u> in 2011 for his exceptional contributions to public service.

Key Facts About Office of Chief Secretary

- Office: The office of the Chief Secretary in India originated during British rule in 1799 under Lord Wellesley and has since become integral to the state's administration.
 - ★ The Chief Secretary serves as the highestranking civil servant in a state, overseeing the state Secretariat and coordinating government functions.

- Appointment and Status: The Chief Secretary is appointed by the Chief Minister (in the name of the Governor of the state) from senior IAS officers based on factors like seniority, merit, and trust.
 - The office was standardized in 1973 to equate it with the position of Secretary to the Government of India.

Powers and Functions:

- Advisor to Chief Minister: Acts as the principal advisor on matters of state administration and provides guidance on policy issues.
- ★ Secretary to the Cabinet: Prepares the Cabinet meeting agenda, records proceedings, and oversees decision implementation.
- Head of Civil Service: Oversees appointments, transfers, and promotions within the state civil service and maintains the morale of the civil servants.

Bihar Student Credit Card Scheme

Why in News?

To empower the youth with higher education, the Bihar government has sanctioned a third installment of Rs 300 crore, bringing the total allocation under the Bihar Student Credit Card Scheme (BSCCY) to ₹900 crore.

This installment, allocated to the Bihar State Education Finance Corporation Limited (BSEFC), Patna, aims to ensure timely and accessible educational loans for students aspiring to pursue higher studies.

Bihar Student Credit Card Scheme (BSCCY)

- Key Features of the Scheme:
 - ★ Eligible students can avail education loans up to ₹4 lakh at a low interest rate of 4% per annum.
 - ★ For female, disabled, and transgender students, the interest rate is just 1%.
 - ★ Loan repayment starts one year after course completion or six months after securing a job—whichever comes first.

- ★ Loans up to ₹2 lakh can be repaid in a maximum of 60 installments, while loans above ₹2 lakh are to be repaid in up to 84 installments.
- ★ An additional interest rebate of 0.25% is provided on early repayments.
- ★ Applications can be made online through the official portal: Mukhyamantri Nishchay Swayam Sahayata Bhata Yojana (MNSSBY) portal.
- Application and Eligibility:
 - ★ Applicants must be permanent residents of Bihar and have passed Class 12 or its equivalent.
 - ★ The applicant's age should not exceed 25 years (relaxation available in special cases).
 - ★ The scheme covers a wide range of courses including engineering, medicine, management, nursing, polytechnic, BA, BSc, BCom, and more.
 - ★ The loan can be used for course fees, purchasing laptops, or other essential studyrelated expenses.
 - → Only students admitted to governmentrecognized institutions are eligible.
 - ★ The required documents to avail of the benefits of the schemes include Aadhaar card, residence certificate, educational certificates, admission proof, passport-size photos, bank passbook, and more.

Bihar State Education Finance Corporation Limited (BSEFC)

- It was incorporated in March 2018 under the Companies Act, 2013, as a Public Limited Company and is 100% owned by the Government of Bihar.
- The main **objectives** of the Corporation are to implement the "Bihar Student Credit Card **Scheme"** with the following goals:
 - ★ Increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio of students in higher education
 - ★ Enable students to access employment opportunities
 - ★ Act as the implementing agency/facilitator for the scheme

New Industrial Corridor & Industrial Zone in Bihar

Why in News?

CM Nitish Kumar has announced the establishment of major industrial projects in Bhagalpur and Gopalganj to foster economic development across Bihar.

Industrial Corridor in Bhagalpur

- In a bid to revitalize Bhagalpur's industrial landscape, the Cabinet also approved the free-ofcost transfer of 96.98 acres of government land in **Goradih circle of Bhagalpur district** to the industries department.
- New Thermal Power Plant in Bhagalpur: Bihar State Electricity Commission will lease land to a private company for the establishment of a thermal power plant.

Industrial Zone in Gopalganj

- The government has approved the transfer of 32.66 acres of land in Gopalgani (Nona Pakad and Khiridih villages) for the establishment of a new industrial area.
 - ★ The land will be handed over to the Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority (BIADA) on a paid basis, for a total value of ₹11.39 crore.
 - ★ This new industrial zone will be key in driving industrial development, attracting investment, and generating employment for the youth and unemployed in the region.

Sectoral Contributions in Bihar's GDP

- As per NITI Aayog, Bihar's real gross state domestic product (GSDP) has grown at an average rate of 5.0% between 2012-13 and 2021-22 (lower than the national average growth rate of 5.6%).
- The services sector has the highest share in GSVA (57.1%), followed by agriculture (24.3%), and industry (17.2%).

Bihar Vriksh Suraksha Diwas

Why in News?

On the occasion of Rakshabandhan 2025 (09th August), Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar celebrated 'Bihar Vriksh Suraksha Diwas' (Tree Protection Day) at Rajdhani Vatika, Patna, by tying a rakhi to a tree and planting saplings.

Key Points

- 'Bihar Vriksh Suraksha Diwas' was launched on 13th August 2012 by CM Nitish Kumar to coincide with Rakshabandhan.
- Its objectives include:
 - → Promoting public awareness on environmental protection.
 - Encouraging tree conservation and large-scale plantation.
 - Mitigating <u>climate change</u> impacts.
 - ★ Supporting greenery expansion and ecotourism in the state.
- The government is also promoting large-scale tree plantation, eco-tourism, and wildlife conservation through schemes like Jal-Jeevan-Hariyali and public awareness campaigns.

India Women Won Bronze at Asia U-20 Rugby

Why in News?

The Asia Rugby Under-20 Sevens Championship 2025 concluded at the Rajgir Sports Complex in Bihar, with the Indian women's team winning the bronze medal by beating Uzbekistan. China defeated Hong Kong in the men's final to claim the championship title.

• The tournament, held for the first time in Bihar, showcased exceptional rugby talent from across Asia.

Asia Rugby U-20 Sevens Championship Results

- Men's Category:
 - ★ Hong Kong (Gold) beat Sri Lanka (Silver)
 - ★ Malaysia (Bronze) beat China

Women's Category:

- ★ China (Gold) beat Hong Kong (Silver)
- ★ India (Bronze) beat Uzbekistan
- India: Bronze medal in women's category
 - ★ The Indian team included four players from Bihar — Gudia Kumari, Anshu Kumari, Alpana Kumari, and Aarti Kumari.

Tournament

- The official mascot of the Asia Rugby Under-20 Sevens Championship 2025 was 'Ashoka', a rabbit.
- Featured 192 players from nine Asian nations, along with 32 coaches/support staff and 50 technical officials.
 - Nations included China, Hong Kong, UAE, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Nepal, and host India.
- The championship featured 40 matches over two days.

Bihar Government Doubles Pension for JP Senanis

Why in News?

The Bihar government has announced an increase in the pension for Jayaprakash (JP) Movement fighters (JP Senanis), who were imprisoned during the Emergency (1975-77) for supporting socialist leader Jayaprakash Narayan's movement (1974).

• CM Nitish Kumar emphasized that the initiative was taken to honor the contributions of these fighters and their role in Bihar's development.

Note: 5th June 2025 marks the 51st anniversary of Jayaprakash Narayan's call for Sampoorna Kranti (Total Revolution), also known as the JP Movement, which was launched on 5th June 1974 by Jayaprakash Narayan at Gandhi Maidan, Patna.

Key Points

- Pension Increase: Fighters who were imprisoned for more than six months will now receive a pension of ₹30,000 per month, up from ₹15,000.
- Those who were jailed for up to six months will see their pension increase from ₹7,500 to ₹15,000 per month.
- In the event of the pensioner's death, their surviving spouse will also receive the same pension amount.

Key Points About JP Senani Samman Pension Scheme

- Scheme: This adjustment falls under the "JP Senani Samman Pension Scheme", which was initiated by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar in 2009.
 - ★ The **scheme is named after** the iconic **socialist** leader, Loknayak Jayaprakash Narayan.
- Beneficiaries: Currently (2025), 3,354 individuals in Bihar are receiving this pension, while CM Nitish Kumar, despite being eligible, has never availed of it.

★ The notable beneficiaries of the scheme are Lalu Prasad Yadav (ex-chief minister of Bihar) and Sushil Kumar Modi (former Deputy CM of Bihar).

• Eligibility Conditions:

- **→ Period of Participation:** 18th March 1974- 21st March 1977.
 - Beneficiaries must have been imprisoned under the Maintenance of Internal Security Act (MISA) or Defence of India Rules (DIR).

• Duration Categories:

- **Category 1:** 1 to 6 months of imprisonment.
- ★ Category 2: Imprisonment exceeding 6 months.
- Additional Benefits: Eligible individuals receive free medical care equivalent to that provided to freedom fighters.

Swatantrata Sainik Samman Pension Scheme

- The Swatantrata Sainik Samman Pension Scheme was launched in 1972 as the Freedom Fighters Pension Scheme and was later renamed and liberalized in August 1980.
- Administered by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, it provides financial support to the freedom fighters who participated in India's independence struggle.
- **Total Beneficiaries (Ever):** 171,689 freedom fighters and their dependents.
- Current Active Pensioners (as of July 2025): 13,212 living freedom fighters.
- Widows Receiving Pension: 9,778.
- Annual Budget (2024-25): ₹600 crore.
- Coverage:
 - ★ Time Period: Freedom fighters who participated in movements between 1857 and 1947.
 - Recognized Movements: Includes 40 major movements, such as the Quit India Movement, Jallianwala Bagh, and others.

12th Men's Asia Cup **Hockey Championship**

Why in News?

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar unveiled the logo, mascot, and trophy for the 12th Men's Asia Cup Hockey Championship.

The Chief Minister also flagged off the Trophy Pride Journey, a symbolic torch relay that will travel through all districts of Bihar leading up to the tournament.



Key Points

- About: The tournament will take place from 29th August 2025 (National Sports Day and Major **Dhyan Chand's** birth anniversary) to 7th September 2025 at the Rajgir International Stadium, marking the first time Bihar is hosting the event.
 - Rajgir, a historic city in Bihar, will host the event following an MoU signed between Hockey India and the Bihar State Sports Authority.
 - ★ This is the second international sporting event for Rajgir, after hosting the Women's Asian **Champions Trophy** in 2024.
- **Tournament Details**: The tournament will feature teams from India, China, Japan, Chinese Taipei, Malaysia, South Korea, Oman, and Bangladesh.
 - ★ The tournament will serve as a qualifier for the 2026 International Hockey Federation (FIH) Men's Hockey World Cup, to be hosted by Belgium and the Netherlands.
 - ★ The winner will qualify directly for the Hockey World Cup.

- Mascot: The official mascot, Chand, symbolizes the courage and agility of India's national animal, the tiger, and is inspired by Major Dhyan Chand, India's legendary hockey player.
 - **Chand's Design**: The red cape represents strength, and the magician's hat honors **Dhyan** Chand's extraordinary talent.

Asian Hockey Federation (AHF)

- The Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) was founded during the Asian Games in Tokyo in 1958, during which hockey made its first Asian Games appearance.
- The **five founding** AHF member countries were India, Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia and
- As one of the five Continental Federations, AHF assists the International Hockey Federation (FIH) in promoting, developing, and administering the sport by supporting its Member National Associations through high-performance projects, grants, equipment, and technical guidance.

Bihar Industrial Investment Promotion Package 2025

Why in News?

The Bihar Cabinet, on 26th August 2025, approved the Bihar Industrial Investment Promotion Package 2025 aimed at boosting industrial growth and attracting largescale private investment in the state.

The initiative, a continuation of the **Bihar Industrial Investment Promotion Policy 2016,** will remain in effect until 31st March 2026 and is part of Bihar's efforts to create 1 crore employment opportunities over the next five years, positioning the state as a significant industrial hub.

Key Highlights of Bihar Industrial Investment Promotion Package 2025

Free Land for Investors: Investors can avail of land at a nominal fee of Rs 1 for setting up industries, with schemes offering up to 10 acres of land for investments of Rs 100 crore and 1,000 jobs.

- ★ Larger projects investing over Rs 1,000 crore will be allotted up to 25 acres.
- ★ Fortune 500 companies will receive 10 acres of land.
- Discounts on Land: Investors not opting for the aforementioned schemes will get land at a 50% discount of the (Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority) BIADA's land rate.
- Fin Tech City Development: The Cabinet also sanctioned **Rs** 408.81 crore for acquiring **242 acres** of land for the Fin Tech City project near Fatuha in Patna.
 - ★ Modeled after (Gujarat International Finance) Tec-City) GIFT City in Gujarat, the project will enhance financial services and enable direct cargo movement to Patna, boosting exports.
- Viability Gap Funding for International Flights: The Cabinet also approved Viability Gap Funding (VGF) for airlines promoting international routes from Patna and Gaya airports.
 - ★ Airlines operating Patna-Kathmandu, Gaya-Sharjah, Gaya-Bangkok, other international routes will receive funding for round trips with a minimum capacity of 150 passengers.
- Financial Incentives: Investors can opt for one of the three financial incentive models:

- ★ Interest subvention of up to ₹40 crore and SGST reimbursement up to 100%.
- ★ 300% SGST reimbursement of the approved project cost over **14 years**.
- ★ 30% capital subsidy based on the approved project cost.
- **Export Incentive:** Export incentives have been increased to ₹40 lakh annually, doubled from the previous amount, with benefits extended for 14 years.
- **Employment Support:** ₹5,000/month per worker for eligible industries and up to 300% ESI/EPF support.
 - → Other units will receive ₹2,000 per month per worker, along with social security benefits.
 - ★ A ₹20,000 skill development grant per employee is also included.
- Green Incentives: 25% reimbursement (up to ₹1 crore) for environmental protection and up to ₹6 lakh for renewable energy usage.

Note: In another development, the Cabinet approved an increase in the honorarium for Kisan Salahkar (Farmer Advisors) from Rs 13,000 to Rs 21,000 per month to further support and empower agricultural advisors in the state.
