# International Day of Non-Violence

# Why in News?

In India, **2**<sup>nd</sup> **October** is celebrated as **Gandhi Jayanti**, honouring Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary.

The day is also observed worldwide as the International Day of Non-Violence, following a 2007 UN resolution supported by over 140 countries, giving it universal significance.

# **Key Facts About Mahatma Gandhi**

- ★ Birth: 2<sup>nd</sup> October 1869 in Porbandar (Gujarat).
- → Brief Profile: Lawyer, politician, social activist, and writer who became the leader of the nationalist movement against the British rule of India.
- ★ Books: Hind Swaraj, My Experiments with Truth (Autobiography)
- ★ Death: He was shot dead by Nathuram Godse on 30<sup>th</sup> January 1948.
  - 30<sup>th</sup> January is observed as Martyrs' Day.
- Role in India's Freedom Struggle
  - ★ Leadership of the Indian National Congress (INC): Mahatma Gandhi emerged as a prominent leader of the INC in the early 20th century, advocating for non-violent resistance and mass mobilisation to challenge British rule.
    - The Belgaum session in 1924 was the only Congress session that was presided over by Gandhi Ji.
  - Non-Cooperation Movement (NCM) (1920-1922): Gandhi launched the NCM in response to the <u>Jallianwala Bagh massacre</u> and the repressive Rowlatt Act.
    - He urged Indians to boycott British institutions, goods, and honours, leading to widespread participation across the country.
    - Gandhi Ji was awarded the Kaisar-i-Hind gold medal in 1915 for his service in the Boer War, but returned it in 1920 to protest the Jallianwala Bagh massacre.

- ★ Salt March (1930): Gandhi led the Salt March to the Gujarati coastal town of Dandi, protesting the British salt tax. This marked the beginning of the Civil Disobedience Movement.
- Quit India Movement (QIM) (1942): Gandhi called for the QIM, demanding an end to British rule in India.
  - His slogan, "Do or Die," inspired millions to participate in protests, strikes, and acts of civil disobedience, marking a significant escalation in the freedom struggle.
- Philosophy of Non-Violence: Throughout his activism, Gandhi emphasised the principles of Satyagraha (truth force) and Ahimsa (nonviolence), advocating for peaceful protests and moral integrity.
  - His approach not only influenced the Indian independence movement but also inspired civil rights movements worldwide, such as Nelson Mandela and Martin Luther King Jr.

# Ayurveda

Samhita Period (1000 BC):
Emerged as mature medical system

Charaka Samhita: Oldest and most authoritative text

Sushruta Samhita: Gives fundamental principles and therapeutic methods in eight specialties

#### Dates back to 10000 – 4000 BC; Siddhar Agasthiyar - Father of Siddha Medicine

- Preventive, promotive, curative, rejuvenative, and rehabilitative health care
- 4 Components: Latro-chemistry, Medical practice, Yogic practice & Wisdom
- Diagnosis based on 3 humors (Mukkuttram) and 8 vital tests (Ennvagai Thervu)

# Sowa Rigpa

#### Origin: Lord Buddha in India before 2500 years

- Traditional medicine in Himalayan regions of Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, etc.
- Recognised in India by Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (As amended in 2010)


# Homeopathy

#### German physician Dr. Christian F. S. Hahnemann codified its fundamental principles

- Medicines prepared mainly from natural substances (plant products, minerals, animal sources)
- Brought in India by European missionaries
   1810; official recognition 1948

  - Single Medicine

- It aims to provide youth with volunteering, internships, mentorship, and learning opportunities through a seamless mobile interface.
- ★ It is currently available in Hindi and English, with more Indian languages to be added gradually.

# Key Features:

- Verified Opportunities: Volunteering, internships, mentorship, and experiential learning.
- → Digital Recognition: Badges, certificates, and personalised youth profiles.
- ★ Career Empowerment: Skill-building resources and Al-enabled resume building.
- **Youth Campaigns:** Active participation in flagship programmes and civic initiatives.
- Interactive Learning: Participation in the Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue (VBYLD) 2026 Quiz.
- Integration with CSCs: By leveraging CSC's vast network of over five lakh Village Level Entrepreneurs (VLEs), the MY Bharat portal will now extend to remote rural areas, enabling seamless youth registration and participation in initiatives like the VBYLD Quiz.
  - ★ The MY Bharat platform, launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023, has become one of India's largest youth-centric ecosystems with over 1.81 crore youth and 1.20 lakh organisations onboarded, serving as a digital backbone for youth engagement, leadership, and nation-building during the Amrit Kaal.



# **Key Points**

- He was an Indian revolutionary, patriot, lawyer, and journalist, born on 4<sup>th</sup> October 1857, in Mandvi, Gujarat.
- In London, he established the Indian Home Rule Society in 1905, which aimed to inspire young Indians to engage in revolutionary activities against British rule.
- He founded 'India House' as a hostel and meeting place for Indian students in London.
- He also launched 'The Indian Sociologist,' a journal which aimed to inspire young Indians to engage in revolutionary activities against British rule.
- He was the first President of the Bombay Arya Samaj and influenced <u>Veer Savarkar.</u>
- In response to British criticism, Varma transitioned from England to Paris and subsequently settled in Geneva during World War I, where he remained until his death on 30th March 1930.
- He had wished for his ashes to be brought back to a free India, a wish realised in August 2003 by then Gujarat Chief Minister Narendra Modi.
  - ★ A memorial called Kranti Teerth dedicated to him was built and inaugurated in 2010 near Mandvi.

# **World Cotton Day 2025**

# Why in News?

Union Ministers Shri Giriraj Singh and Shri Pabitra Margherita attended the **World Cotton Day 2025** celebration in New Delhi on **7**<sup>th</sup> **October**.

• The event was jointly organised by the Ministry of Textiles and the Confederation of Indian Textile Industry (CITI), with the theme "Cotton 2040: Technology, Climate & Competitiveness."



# **Key Points**

- About: World Cotton Day was established in 2019 when four cotton-producing countries in sub-Saharan Africa—Benin, Burkina Faso, Chad, and Mali, collectively known as the Cotton Four—proposed to the World Trade Organisation the idea of celebrating World Cotton Day on 7th October.
- Objective: It aims to create awareness of the need for market access for cotton and cotton-related products from least developed countries, foster sustainable trade policies and enable developing countries to benefit more from every step of the cotton value chain.
- Interesting Facts About Cotton:
  - ★ The top five cotton-producing countries are China, India, Brazil, the United States of America, and Pakistan, which together account for more than three-quarters of global production.
    - India is the largest producer of cotton globally, accounting for 23% of total global cotton production.
  - ★ Cotton sustains about 24 million growers and benefits over 100 million families globally.



- Cotton is the second-most used fibre globally after polyester, making up approximately 20% of total fibre demand.
- Approximately **80% of cotton is used in apparel,** with the remainder used in home textiles and industrial products.
- Governance in India: The Cotton Corporation of India (CCI), established in July 1970 under the Ministry of Textiles, stabilises cotton prices through price support measures and supports the domestic textile industry with commercial purchasing operations, especially during the lean season.

# Why in News?

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) celebrated World Habitat Day 2025 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, with the theme "Urban Solutions to Crisis."

• The event highlighted the importance of making cities more resilient, inclusive, and sustainable in addressing challenges like <u>climate change</u>, migration, and <u>rapid urbanisation</u>.

## **Key Points**

- Background: In 1985, the United Nations designated the first Monday of October each year as World Habitat Day. World Habitat Day was first celebrated in 1986, with the theme "Shelter is My Right", and Nairobi was the host city.
- Objective: This day serves to reflect on the state of our habitats and emphasises the fundamental right of all individuals to have access to adequate shelter.
- Theme 2025: The theme for World Habitat Day 2025, observed on 6<sup>th</sup> October, is 'Urban Crises Response,' focusing on addressing various crises, such as climate change and conflicts, that contribute to inequality in urban areas, while promoting effective crisis response tools and approaches.

#### **Scroll of Honour Award**

- Launched by the United Nations Human Settlements Programme in 1989, the UN-Habitat Scroll of Honour Award is the most prestigious global recognition for human settlements.
- This award acknowledges exceptional contributions in areas such as:
  - ★ Shelter provision (adequate, affordable housing).
  - ★ Highlighting the plight of the homeless.
  - ★ Leadership in **post-conflict reconstruction**.
  - Improving urban life quality and human settlements.

# 93rd Air Force Day

# Why in News?

The Air Chief Marshal Amar Preet Singh conveyed his greetings to the nation on the 93<sup>rd</sup> Air Force Day, honouring the brave air warriors who have protected the nation's skies with sacrifice, dedication, and professionalism.



# **Key Points**

- About: Celebrated annually on 8<sup>th</sup> October to honour the establishment of the Indian Air Force (IAF) on 8<sup>th</sup> October 1932.
- Early Years: The IAF's first operational flight took place on 1st April 1933, beginning a vision of air power that has shaped India's defence over the decades.
  - ★ From a small force with limited personnel and aircraft, the IAF has grown to become the world's fourth-largest air force, involved in various military and humanitarian missions.
- Motto: The motto of IAF is Touch the sky with Glory (Nabhah Sparsam Diptam), which has been taken from the eleventh chapter of the <u>Bhagavad</u> Gita.
- **Theme:** The 2025 theme is centred on the force's contribution to **Operation Sindoor.**
- 2025 Celebrations: This year's celebrations featured a farewell to the iconic MiG-21, a grand flypast with Rafale, Su-30MKI, C-17 Globemaster, Apache Guardian, and others, along with parades, air shows, and exhibitions showcasing the IAF's technological advancements and operational readiness.

# Why in News?

On the occasion of World Mental Health Day 2025, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare Jagat Prakash Nadda launched a series of new features under the National Tele-Mental Health Programme (Tele-MANAS).

# **Key Points**

- App Enhancements: The Tele-MANAS mobile app enables users to access mental health support anytime, anywhere, strengthening India's digital healthcare framework.
  - ★ The app now features a multi-lingual interface, chatbot, accessibility improvements, and an emergency response module.
  - ★ Available in 10 regional languages (Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Tamil, Telugu, Odia, and Punjabi) in addition to English and Hindi.
  - Accessibility features make the interface userfriendly for persons with disabilities, including the visually impaired.
  - ★ Chatbot "Asmi" allows users to engage, seek information, and access mental health support.
  - ★ Emergency module ensures quick guidance and support during crises.
- Mental Health Ambassador: The Minister announced that Deepika Padukone has been designated as the Mental Health Ambassador to raise awareness about access to mental health services.
- World Mental Health Day:
  - ★ About: World Mental Health Day, observed on 10<sup>th</sup> October, aims to raise global awareness about mental health issues, encourage dialogue, and mobilise efforts to make mental health care accessible for all.

★ Theme: The 2025 theme, "Access to Services—
Mental Health in Catastrophes and
Emergencies," underscores the importance of
ensuring mental health care during crises such
as <u>natural disasters</u>, armed conflicts, and
pandemics.

# Why in News?

Shri Pralhad Joshi, the Union Minister for Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution and New & Renewable Energy lead the **World Standards Day** programme on 14<sup>th</sup> October 2025.

• The event was organized by the <u>Bureau of Indian</u> <u>Standards (BIS)</u>, under the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, Government of India.

# **Key Points**

- About: The celebration at the National Institute of Training for Standardization (NITS) featured the release of the National Lighting Code of India 2025, along with the launch of the Learning Management System (LMS) and the Online Standards Development (OSD) Module on the BIS Standards Portal.
- World Standards Day:
  - ★ About: The first World Standards Day was first celebrated in 1970 to raise global awareness about the importance of standards in fostering safety, quality, and international trade.
    - The day was established by International Organization for Standardization(ISO), in collaboration with International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) and International Telecommunication Union (ITU), to honor the global community of standard developers and their contributions.

- → Purpose: World Standards Day celebrates the pivotal role of standards in ensuring quality, safety, and sustainability. It recognizes the collaborative efforts of experts—scientists, engineers, policymakers, and innovators who work to create these frameworks.
- ★ Theme: The 2025 theme, "A Shared Vision for a Better World: Standards for Sustainable Development Goals" emphasises the role of international standards in promoting global cooperation towards achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

## **Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS)**

- BIS is the statutory national standard body of India established under the BIS Act, 2016, for the harmonious development of the activities of standardisation, marking and quality certification of goods.
  - It was initially set up as the Indian Standards Institution (ISI) that came into being on 6<sup>th</sup> January 1947.
  - ★ It is headquartered in New Delhi.
  - ★ It operates various schemes like Product Certification (ISI mark), Hallmarking of Gold and Silver Jewellers, ECO Mark Scheme (for labelling of environment friendly products).

# Defence Minister Releases Book on Future-Ready Armed Forces

# Why in News?

On **14**<sup>th</sup> **October 2025, Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh** released a book titled "Ready, Relevant and Resurgent II: Shaping a Future Ready Force", authored by **Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan**.

# **Key Points**

The book presents a comprehensive and forward-looking blueprint for shaping India's Armed Forces to meet the challenges of the future.

- It provides an in-depth analysis of the evolving nature of warfare, tracing the evolution of conflict and examining emerging domains such as cyberspace, space-enabled operations, and cognitive warfare—highlighting their increasing significance for the Indian Armed Forces.
- Emphasizing the importance of strong military leadership and institutional resilience, the author envisions a bold reimagination of India's military future—one that draws from historical insight, harnesses technological innovation, and is anchored in the vision of a ready, reliable, and resurgent India.

#### **Chief of Defence Staff**

- The post of Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) was created in 2019. The CDS acts as the Principal Military Adviser to the Defence Minister on all tri-services matters.
- As the Permanent Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff Committee, the CDS is supported by the Headquarters of the Integrated Defence Staff in performing assigned functions.
- The Department of Military Affairs is headed by the Chief of Defence Staff, who holds the rank of a four-star General, with salary and perquisites at par with a Service Chief.

# India-South Korea Naval Bilateral Exercise (IN-RoKN)

#### Why in News?

The inaugural edition of the India–South Korea Naval Bilateral Exercise (IN–RoKN) commenced on 13<sup>th</sup> October 2025 at the Busan Naval Base, South Korea, marking a significant milestone in the growing strategic partnership between the Indian Navy (IN) and the Republic of Korea Navy (RoKN).

# **Key Points**

The Commanding Officer of INS Sahyadri will also pay courtesy calls on senior RoKN officials and local dignitaries.
- ★ Sea Phase: The sea segment will include complex joint manoeuvres and operational exercises between INS Sahyadri and ROKS Gyeongnam, aimed at strengthening tactical coordination and operational synergy.
- INS Sahyadri: An indigenously designed and constructed Shivalik-class stealth frigate, INS Sahyadri was commissioned in 2012 and serves under the Eastern Fleet of the Eastern Naval **Command.** headquartered at **Visakhapatnam**.
  - ★ The ship stands as a testament to India's 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India) initiative and its indigenous shipbuilding capabilities.
- Strategic Significance: As the Indo-Pacific region assumes greater geopolitical importance, both India and the Republic of Korea have reaffirmed their commitment to developing robust maritime partnerships founded on shared interests, mutual respect, and common values.

# World Food Day 2025

# Why in News?

World Food Day is observed every year on 16th October to promote awareness about food security, nutrition, and sustainable agriculture.

# **Key Points**

- About: World Food Day marks the establishment of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) by the United Nations (UN) on 16th October, 1945.
  - ★ The World Food Day came into existence in 1979 during the **FAO's 20**<sup>th</sup> **General Conference** and the UN General Assembly endorsed it in 1984.
  - Right to food is recognized by the <u>Universal</u> **Declaration of Human Rights 1948.**
- Theme: The theme for 2025 is "Hand in Hand for Better Foods and a Better Future", highlighting the power of global collaboration to transform agrifood systems.
- India's Status: Over the past decade, India's foodgrain production rose by nearly 90 million metric tonnes, reflecting strong agricultural growth.
  - ★ Fruit and vegetable output expanded significantly, increasing by over 64 million metric tonnes during the same period.
  - India now ranks first globally in milk and millets production and second in fish, fruit, and vegetable output, with honey and egg production doubling since 2014.
- Indian Initiatives: Flagship initiatives like the National Food Security Act, 2013, Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana, PM POSHAN Scheme, Antyodaya Anna Yojana, Rice Fortification and Price Stabilisation Fund (PSF) are reinforcing India's commitment to ensuring food and nutritional security.

# Birth Anniversary of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam

# Why in News?

On 15th October 2025, President Droupadi Murmu paid floral tributes to Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, former President of India, on his birth anniversary at Rashtrapati Bhavan.














# **Key Points**

- About: Born on 15<sup>th</sup> October 1931 in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu, Dr Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam specialised in Aeronautical Engineering from the Madras Institute of Technology.
- Space Research: He served as the Project Director for India's first indigenous Satellite Launch Vehicle (SLV-III), which successfully placed the Rohini satellite in near-earth orbit in July 1980, making India a member of the exclusive Space Club.
  - ★ He played a key role in the evolution of the ISRO launch vehicle program, particularly the PSLV configuration, which became a cornerstone of India's space exploration capabilities.
- Pofence Development: As the Chief Executive of the Integrated Guided Missile Development Programme (IGMDP), he was instrumental in the development and operationalisation of key missile systems such as AGNI and PRITHVI.
  - As Scientific Adviser to the Defence Minister and Secretary of the Department of Defence Research & Development from July 1992 to December 1999, Dr Kalam led India's missile systems weaponisation and oversaw the successful Pokhran-II nuclear tests, making India a nuclear weapons state.
  - His contributions also extended to self-reliance in defence systems, including the development of the <u>Light Combat Aircraft (LCA)</u>.
- Vision for Developed India: His leadership extended to the Technology Information, Forecasting and Assessment Council (TIFAC), where, as Chairman, he spearheaded the Technology Vision 2020 project.

- Books: His works, including "Wings of Fire", "India 2020 - A Vision for the New Millennium", "My Journey", and "Ignited Minds - Unleashing the Power Within India", have been translated into multiple languages and remain popular worldwide.
- Recognition and Honours: He received 30 honorary doctorates and was awarded India's highest civilian honours: Padma Bhushan (1981), Padma Vibhushan (1990), and the Bharat Ratna (1997).
- President of India: On 25th July 2002, Dr Kalam became the 11<sup>th</sup> President of India, where he continued to champion the vision of a developed nation.
  - ★ His presidency focused on achieving the goal of transforming India into a global leader by 2020, leaving behind a legacy of scientific excellence, national pride, and youth empowerment.

# Google Artificial Intelligence Hub in Visakhapatnam

# Why in News?

Google has unveiled plans to invest **\$15 billion** over the next **five years**(2026–2030) to establish a cutting-edge **Artificial Intelligence (AI) hub** in **Visakhapatnam**, Andhra Pradesh.

# **Key Points**

- About: The project was announced during the 'Bharat AI Shakti' event in New Delhi, where Google CEO Sundar Pichai revealed that he had discussed the project with Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- Largest Al Hub: The new data centre in Visakhapatnam will be Google's largest Al hub outside the United States.
  - ★ This forms part of Google's broader strategy to invest approximately \$85 billion this year to expand its data centre capacity, meeting the growing demand for AI services globally.
- Services: The Google AI hub will offer a full range of AI solutions, leveraging Google's proprietary <u>Tensor Processing Units (TPUs)</u>, which are designed to be twice as power-efficient as traditional chips.

#### **Key Points**

- About: The joint exercise aims to enhance interoperability and strengthen maritime cooperation between the two nations through a series of professional and operational engagements, both at sea and ashore.
- Participating Units:
  - ★ INS Kavaratti: An anti-submarine warfare corvette from the Eastern Fleet of the Indian Navy.
  - ★ KRI John Lie: A corvette from the Indonesian Navy, equipped with an integral helicopter.
- Harbour Phase: The harbour phase includes activities such as cross-deck visits, joint yoga sessions, friendly sports events, and professional exchanges under the Subject Matter Expert

- Exchange (SMEE) programme, all aimed at fostering professional interaction and camaraderie between the naval personnel of both nations.
- Sea Phase: The sea phase will feature complex and high-tempo maritime operations aimed at improving tactical coordination between the two navies. These operations will include Helicopter manoeuvres, Air defence exercises, Weapon firing drills and Visit, Board, Search and Seizure (VBSS) operations.
- Significance: The exercise highlights the shared commitment of both nations towards maintaining stability and peace in the Indo-Pacific region.

# Why in News?

The **United Nations Troop Contributing Countries** (**UNTCC**) Chiefs Conclave 2025, hosted by the Indian Army from 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> October 2025, brought together senior military leaders from 32 nations that play a key role in global **UN peacekeeping** operations.



#### **Key Points**

- About: The conclave is attended by senior military officials from 32 nations, including Algeria, Armenia, Australia, Bangladesh, Brazil, Egypt, Ethiopia, France, Ghana, India, Italy, Kenya, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Poland, Rwanda, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Thailand, Uganda, Uruguay, and Vietnam.
  - ★ The event also features defence exhibitions aimed at building shared capacities for peacekeeping missions.

  - ✓ India, one of the largest contributors to UN peacekeeping, has convened this high-level forum to discuss best practices, share insights, and build mutual understanding for future peacekeeping.
- Technology Demonstration: The chiefs witnessed a demonstration of integrated, <u>new-age military</u> <u>technology</u> by the Indian Army, showcasing various indigenous military equipment.
- 4C Formula for UN Peacekeeping: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh proposed a guiding principle of enhanced Consultation, Cooperation, Coordination, and Capacity Building (4C) to address emerging challenges in peacekeeping.
  - ★ He noted that the Centre for UN Peacekeeping in New Delhi has trained participants from over 90 countries, contributing significantly to the development of interoperability among peacekeepers.

# **United Nations Peacekeeping (UNPK)**

- The first UNPK mission, the United Nations
   Truce Supervision Organisation (UNTSO),
   was established in May 1948 to monitor the
   <u>Armistice Agreement</u> between Israel and its
   Arab neighbours with a small team of military
   observers.
- They are deployed by the <u>UN Security Council</u> to support ceasefires and peace agreements and are called Blue Helmets due to the light blue colour symbolising peace on the UN flag.
- Currently, over 61,000 military and police peacekeepers from 119 countries and more than 7,000 civilian personnel serve in 11 UN Peacekeeping Missions.

# INS Sahyadri Participates in JAIMEX-25

# Why in News?

Indian Naval Ship (INS) Sahyadri, an indigenously built Shivalik-class Guided Missile Stealth Frigate,

participated in the Sea Phase of JAIMEX-25 (Japan-India Maritime Exercise) from 16<sup>th</sup>–18<sup>th</sup> October 2025, followed by a Harbour Phase at Yokosuka, Japan, on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2025.



# **Key Points**

- Objective:
  - ✓ JAIMEX-25 reinforces the 'Special Strategic and Global Partnership' between India and Japan established in 2014, aiming to promote peace, stability, and security in the Indo-Pacific, while reflecting their shared vision of a free, open, and inclusive maritime region.

#### Phases:

- ★ The Sea Phase featured INS Sahyadri, JMSDF ships Asahi, Oumi, and submarine Jinryu, conducting advanced Anti-Submarine Warfare exercises, missile defence drills, flying operations, and underway replenishment to enhance interoperability.
- ★ The Harbour Phase at Yokosuka focused on professional and cultural exchanges such as cross-deck visits, operational planning, sharing of best practices, and a combined Yoga session, as part of INS Sahyadri's Long Range Deployment in the Indo-Pacific region.
- Other Excercises: Other bilateral exercises between India and Japan include the Malabar exercise (Naval Exercise), 'Veer Guardian' (Air Force), and Dharma Guardian (Army).
- About INS Sahyadri:
  - → INS Sahyadri, commissioned in 2012, represents India's advancement in indigenous defence technology and aligns with the nation's vision of 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India).

# Why in News?

Dr. Pinky Anand, Senior Advocate and former Additional Solicitor General of India, has been appointed as a Judge of the Bahrain International Commercial Court (BICC), following the 2024 appointment of former Supreme Court judge Sanjay Kishan Kaul to the same court.



# **Dr. Pinky Anand**

- Packground: A Harvard Law School graduate and Inlaks Scholar, Dr. Pinky Anand has over 40 years of legal experience, having served as Additional Solicitor General of India (2014–2020), with expertise in constitutional law, civil arbitration, and criminal law.
- International Representation: Represented India in various national and international fora, including BRICS; founding member of the BRICS Legal Forum.
- **Honours:** Awarded the French National Order of Merit by the President of France.

# Bahrain International Commercial Court (BICC)

- The Bahrain International Commercial Court (BICC), established to handle complex cross-border commercial disputes, will commence operations with a swearing-in ceremony for judges on 5th November 2025, attended by the Bahraini monarchy and the Prime Minister.
- The BICC is presided over by renowned arbitration expert Jan Paulsson and comprises 17 judges — 7 women and 10 men — representing diverse jurisdictions across the globe.
- The court was established under a **treaty between** Bahrain and Singapore in March 2024, and is modelled on the Singapore International **Commercial Court (SICC)** to promote international best practices in commercial dispute resolution.

# **Neeraj Chopra Conferred Honorary Rank of Lieutenant** Colonel

# Why in News?

Two-time Olympic medallist Neeraj Chopra has been conferred the Honorary rank of Lieutenant Colonel in the Territorial Army in recognition of his outstanding achievements and service to the nation.

The pipping ceremony was held at South Block, New Delhi where Defence Minister Rajnath Singh formally presented the rank insignia in the presence of Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi.













## **Key Points**

- About: Born on 24th December 1997 in Khandra village, Panipat district, Haryana, Neeraj Chopra hails from a farming family and has emerged as one of India's most celebrated athletes.
- Journey in the Indian Army:
  - ★ Neeraj Chopra joined the Indian Army in August 2016 as a Naib Subedar in the Rajputana Rifles Regiment and was promoted to Subedar in 2021 in recognition of his outstanding achievements in athletics.
  - ★ In 2022, after his Olympic triumph, he was further promoted to Subedar Major and awarded the Param Vishisht Seva Medal, the highest peacetime honour of the Indian Army.
  - ★ In April 2025, President Smt Droupadi Murmu granted him the Honorary Commission as Lieutenant Colonel in recognition of his service to the nation and outstanding sporting achievements.

# Achievements in Sports:

- ★ Tokyo Olympics 2020: Created history by becoming the first Indian athlete to win an Olympic Gold Medal in track and field.
- ★ World Athletics Championships 2023: Won the Gold Medal, further strengthening India's presence in global athletics.
- → Paris Olympics 2024: Secured a Silver Medal, maintaining his elite performance level.
- ★ Asian Games & Commonwealth Games: Multiple **Gold Medals** showcasing dominance in javelin throw across international events.

# **International Snow Leopard** Day and '#23for23' Initiative

# Why in News?

India celebrated International Snow Leopard Day on 23rd October 2025 with a unique nationwide campaign titled '#23for23', which encouraged people to dedicate 23 minutes to physical activity in order to raise awareness about the conservation of **snow leopards** and their **fragile** high-altitude habitats.

# **Key Points**

- **About the Initiative:** The campaign '#23for23' was launched to symbolize 23 minutes of active participation for the year 2023, promoting awareness and public engagement in wildlife conservation.
  - ★ It was organized under the aegis of the Global Snow Leopard and Ecosystem Protection Programme (GSLEP) in collaboration with the **Snow Leopard Trust Worldwide.**
- India's Conservation Achievements:
  - ★ The first-ever Snow Leopard Census conducted across the Indian Himalayas recorded 718 individual snow leopards, out of which 477 are in Ladakh.
  - ★ India has identified snow leopard as a flagship species for the high-altitude Himalayas.
- International Snow Leopard Day: It came into being in 2013, following the adoption of the Bishkek Declaration in Kyrgyzstan where 12 **countries** that host snow leopard populations agreed to collaborate in their conservation efforts.
- Countries Hosting Snow Leopards: Afghanistan, Bhutan, China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan.













# Facts About Snow Leopards (Panthera uncia)

- About: Medium-sized cats known for their elusive nature and ability to thrive in harsh, high-altitude
- Habitat: Native to mountains of Central and South Asia, typically found at elevations between 9,800 and 17,000 feet.
  - ★ Population estimates range between 3,500 and 7,000 individuals in the wild.
- **Feature:** Possess thick, greyish-white fur that provides camouflage against snow and rocks.
- Ecological Importance: Serve as top predators and Indicator species, as their presence reflects the health of their high-altitude ecosystems.
  - ★ Their kills provide food for scavengers like vultures and wolves, supporting other species.















# Global Forest Resources Assessment 2025

## Why in News?

India has achieved a major milestone in global environmental conservation by climbing to the **ninth position worldwide** in terms of **total forest area**, according to the **Global Forest Resources Assessment (FRA) 2025** released by the <u>Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO)</u> in **Bali, Indonesia**.

• This marks an improvement from the tenth position in the previous assessment, reflecting the country's growing commitment to sustainable forest management.

# **Key Points**

- About: The Global Forest Resources Assessment (FRA), conducted by the FAO, provides a comprehensive overview of the world's forest resources—including their condition, management, and uses—based on country-submitted data verified through an expert review process.
  - ★ The report helps monitor international commitments related to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Paris Agreement on Climate Change, the Kunming—Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, and the United Nations Strategic Plan for Forests (2017–2030).

#### Findings About India:

- ★ The report highlights that India's total forest area now stands at approximately 72.73 million hectares, positioning the country ninth globally.
- ★ India also continues to hold the third position in the world in terms of annual forest area gain, showcasing the success of its large-scale afforestation and conservation initiatives.
- ★ The FAO report also highlights India's large area under agroforestry, noting that out of 55.4 million hectares of global agroforestry land across 91 countries, India and Indonesia together account for nearly 70% of the global total.

India alone has 12.87 million hectares under agroforestry, which plays a critical role in <u>carbon sequestration</u>, livelihood generation, and ecosystem restoration.

#### • Global Trends:

- According to the FRA 2025, forests currently cover about 4.14 billion hectares, which is roughly one-third of the Earth's total land area.
- ★ The report notes a slowing of deforestation rates worldwide, although the current rate of 10.9 million hectares per year remains high.
- More than half of the world's forests are now covered by long-term management plans, and nearly 20% fall within legally established protected areas.
- Globally, Russia tops the list with 832.6 million hectares of forest, followed by Brazil, Canada, the United States, and China.

# East Timor Becomes 11th Member of ASEAN

# Why in News

East Timor (Timor-Leste) has officially become the 11th member of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) after a 14-year wait.

• The formal induction took place at a ceremony in Kuala Lumpur, marking ASEAN's first expansion since the 1990s.

# **Key Points**

- About: East Timor applied for ASEAN membership in 2011, was granted observer status in 2022, and achieved full membership in 2025 after a 14-year wait.
  - ★ The last country to join ASEAN was Cambodia in 1999.
- Impact: Membership will enable it to participate in ASEAN's free trade agreements, access investment opportunities, and expand its presence in a broader regional market.
- About East Timor (Timor-Leste):
  - ★ It is bounded by the Timor Sea to the southeast, the Wetar Strait to the north, the Ombai Strait to the northwest, and western Timor (part of the Indonesian province of East Nusa Tenggara) to the southwest.

- ★ It was colonised by Portugal in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, was annexed by Indonesia in 1975 after Portugal withdrew, leading to a long struggle for independence.
- ★ In a 1999 UN-supervised referendum, it voted for independence, which led to further violence until peacekeeping forces intervened, and the country was officially recognised by the UN in 2002.

Eminent physicist Jayant Vishnu Narlikar has been posthumously selected for the Vigyan Ratna Puraskar 2025, the country's highest honour for lifetime achievement in science and technology.

The Government of India announced the second edition of the Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar 2025, recognising 23 individuals and one institution across four categories — Vigyan Ratna, Vigyan Shri, Vigyan Yuva, and Vigyan Team.



# **Key Points**

- About Jayant Vishnu Narlikar:
  - ★ Jayant Vishnu Narlikar (1938–2025) was an eminent astrophysicist known for his work on cosmology, general relativity, and the steadystate theory of the universe.
  - ★ A close collaborator of Sir Fred Hoyle, he codeveloped the Hoyle-Narlikar theory of gravitation.
  - ★ He served as the founding director of the Inter-University Centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics (IUCAA), Pune.
  - ★ His contribution bridged Indian international research, and his popular science writings inspired generations of young scientists.

- ★ Instituted in **2023**, the RVP awardees are recommended by the Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar Committee (RVPC), chaired by the Principal Scientific Adviser, with the first ceremony held in August 2024.

# Categories:

- ★ Vigyan Ratna: Recognises lifetime achievements and contributions in any field of science and technology.
- ★ Vigyan Shri: Awarded for distinguished contributions in any field of science and technology.
- ★ Vigyan Yuva: Given to young scientists 45 years) for exceptional achievements in science and technology.
- ★ Vigyan Team: Conferred on teams of three or more scientists, researchers, or innovators for outstanding collaborative work.

# Why in News

India has launched the large-scale tri-service exercise 'Trishul' along the western border with Pakistan, underscoring its readiness to counter any provocation and strengthen defence preparedness amid rising tensions in the Sir Creek region.



# **Key Points**

- About: The exercise is scheduled from 30<sup>th</sup> October to 10th November 2025 and involves large-scale participation from the Army, Navy, and Air Force and aims to enhance operational readiness, joint coordination, and multi-domain warfare capabilities.
  - ★ The exercise, codenamed "Trishul" and internally referred to as "Mahagurjar", will cover the **Thar Desert region** extending from Jaisalmer (Rajasthan) to Sir Creek (Gujarat).
- Objective: The primary goal is to test and refine **joint operations** between the three services — the Army, Navy, and Air Force — across land, sea, air, and cyber domains.
  - The drills will emphasise unified operations, deep-strike missions, amphibious warfare, and multi-domain combat readiness.
  - ★ The exercise also aims to enhance coordination among different commands and validate new indigenous weapon systems under realistic battlefield conditions.

#### Scale and Participation:

- ★ The Army has deployed more than 20,000 soldiers, supported by T-90S and Arjun tanks, howitzers, armed helicopters, and missile systems.
- The IAF is conducting high-tempo 'Mahagujraj' operations, deploying Rafale and Sukhoi-30MKI fighter jets, transport and refuelling aircraft (IL-78), AEW&C systems, unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs).
- ★ The Navy has stationed frigates and destroyers off the Saurashtra and Gujarat coasts for amphibious and maritime combat drills.
- Notice to Airmen (NOTAM): The Indian Air Force (IAF) has issued a Notice to Airmen (NOTAM) restricting civilian flights over large parts of Rajasthan and Gujarat during the exercise, while **Pakistan** has similarly restricted air routes over its central and southern airspace, likely for its own military drills or weapons testing around 28th-29th October 2025.











# Cyclone Montha

# Why in News?

The cyclonic storm "Montha", forming over the Bay of Bengal, is intensifying as it approaches the eastern coast of India, prompting Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, and Tamil Nadu to issue high-alert warnings.



# Cyclones in India

- Recent Cyclones Tauktae, Vayu, Nisarga and Mekanu (in Arabian Sea) and Asani, Amphan, Fani, Nivar, Bulbul, Titli, Yaas and Sitrang (in Bay of Bengal)













# **Key Points**

- Definition: Cyclones are fast air circulations around low-pressure areas, rotating anticlockwise in the Northern Hemisphere and clockwise in the Southern, often causing storms and severe weather.
- Classification of Cyclones: IMD classifies low-pressure systems in the Bay of Bengal and Arabian Sea by damage potential, following World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) guidelines.

Type of Disturbances	Wind Speed in Km/h
Low Pressure	Less than 31
Depression	31-49
Deep Depression	49-61
Cyclonic Storm	61-88
Severe Cyclonic Storm	88-117
Super Cyclone	More than 221

- Naming of Cyclones: The WMO/ESCAP (United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific) Panel on Tropical Cyclones, which includes 13 North Indian Ocean countries, manages cyclone naming for the Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal.
  - ★ The panel has a pre-set list of names submitted by 13 countries to be used sequentially.
  - ★ Names are chosen in order, column by column, regardless of where the cyclone forms.
- Recent Cyclones:
  - ★ The name 'Montha', meaning beautiful or fragrant flower, was contributed by Thailand.
  - ★ The first cyclonic storm of the season was named 'Shakhti', as suggested by Sri Lanka. Other recent cyclones include Shakhti (Sri Lanka), Fengal (Saudi Arabia), Dana (Qatar), Asna (Pakistan), and Remal (Oman).
  - \* According to the naming list, the next cyclone will be Senyar (UAE), followed by Ditwah (Yemen), Arnab (Bangladesh), and Murasu (India).

# Passenger Trains Begin Operations on DFC

# Why in News?

For the first time in Indian Railways history, passenger trains have begun operating on the Dedicated Freight Corridor (DFC) network.

## **Key Points**

- Traditionally, the Dedicated Freight Corridors (DFCs) were designed exclusively for freight transport, aiming to enhance logistics efficiency and reduce congestion on existing railway lines.
- However, due to the heavy rush during Chhath Puja (25th-28th October 2025), the Railways has allowed empty passenger coaching rakes and special trains to run on the DFC for the first time.
- This step enables the operation of a larger number of passenger and express trains during the festive period.
- **DFC** consists of two arms:
  - 🖈 Eastern DFC (EDFC): Ludhiana (Punjab) Dankuni (West Bengal) via Uttar Pradesh and Bihar (Approx. 1,839 km). The World Bank is funding a majority of the EDFC.
  - ★ Western DFC (WDFC): Jawaharlal Nehru Port Terminal (JNPT), Mumbai Dadri (Approx. 1,506 km). The Japan International Cooperation Agency is funding it.











# Terms of Reference of 8th CPC Approved

# Why in News?

The **Union Cabinet** has approved the **Terms of Reference (ToR)** for the **8**<sup>th</sup> <u>Central Pay Commission (CPC)</u>, which is responsible for reviewing and recommending revisions in the pay structure and retirement benefits of **central government employees and pensioners**.

## **Key Points**

- About: The formation of the 8<sup>th</sup> CPC was first announced in January 2025, and its Terms of Reference were approved by the Cabinet on 28th October 2025.
  - ★ The Commission will submit its recommendations within 18 months of its constitution, impacting around 50 lakh central government employees (including defence personnel) and 69 lakh pensioners.
  - ★ The revised pay and pension structures are expected to be implemented from January 2026, after the submission of the Commission's report.
- Composition of 8<sup>th</sup> CPC:

Chairperson	Justice Ranjana Prakash Desai (Former Supreme Court Judge)
Part-time Member	Professor Pulak Ghosh (Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore)

- Terms of Reference (ToR): The 8<sup>th</sup> CPC has been tasked with making recommendations after considering:
  - **Economic conditions** of the country and the need for **fiscal prudence**.
  - ★ Availability of resources for developmental expenditure and welfare measures.
  - ★ The unfunded cost of non-contributory pension schemes (particularly the pre-2004 pension liabilities).
  - ★ The impact on state finances, as state governments often align their pay scales with the Centre.
  - ★ The current emolument structure, benefits, and working conditions of employees in central public sector undertakings (CPSUs) and the private sector.
  - Background: The Pay Commission is typically constituted once every 10 years to review and recommend changes in the salary structure, allowances, and pensions of government employees.

★ The 7<sup>th</sup> CPC was constituted in 2014, and its recommendations were implemented from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016.

# Justice Surya Kant Appointed as 53<sup>rd</sup> CJI

# Why in News?

President Droupadi Murmu has appointed Justice
Surya Kant as the 53<sup>rd</sup> Chief Justice of India (CJI).



# **Key Points**

- About:
  - He will assume office as the Chief Justice of India on 24<sup>th</sup> November 2025, **succeeding CJI B. R. Gavai**, and will serve a **15-month tenure** until 10<sup>th</sup> February 2027.
  - ★ He will be the first Chief Justice of India from Haryana.
  - ★ He is a first-generation lawyer known for his forthright observations, balanced judgments, and emphasis on constitutional morality.
  - His tenure is expected to focus on judicial accessibility, administrative reforms, and consistency in constitutional interpretation.
- Notable Judgments:
  - ★ Article 370: Part of the five-judge bench that upheld the abrogation of <u>Article 370</u>.
  - Minority Tag to AMU: Member of the bench that delivered the verdict on Aligarh Muslim University's minority status.
  - ★ Election Commission Oversight: Currently heading a bench supervising the Special Intensive Revision exercise in Bihar.

About Chief Justice of India:

- ★ A Supreme Court judge, including the CJI, is appointed by the **President** under **Article 124** (2).
- ★ The senior-most judge is designated as CJI based on length of service ( it is customary practice, not a legal requirement ).
- ★ To qualify as CJI, one must be a citizen of India, have served as a High Court judge for 5 years or as an advocate for 10 years, or be a distinguished jurist in the President's opinion.

★ The CJI can only be removed by the President after an address by **Parliament**, supported by a special majority in both Houses.

# **National Unity Day**

# Why in News?

Rashtriya Ekta Diwas(National Unity Day), observed annually on 31st October to honour Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's role in unifying India, holds special significance in 2025 as it marks his **150th birth anniversary.** 

# **Key Points**

# National Unity Day:

- ★ It embodies the values of unity, integrity, and inclusiveness championed by Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel.
- ★ It was first celebrated in 2014, following the Government's decision to honour Patel's monumental role in nation-building.
- During the 2015 observance, Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' initiative to strengthen connections and cultural exchange among people of different regions.

#### **Events:**

- The Sardar@150 Unity March (Yatra), organised by the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports through the My Bharat platform, aims to promote unity, patriotism, and civic responsibility among youth in line with the vision of 'Ek Bharat, Aatmanirbhar Bharat'.
- ★ The "Run for Unity," a nationwide marathon symbolising national cohesion, was held on 31st October 2025 across major cities, with a flag-off event in New Delhi.

## Statue of Unity:

- ★ On 31<sup>st</sup> October 2018, the Statue of Unity, the world's tallest statue at 182 meters (600 feet), was inaugurated at Kevadia, Gujarat, honouring Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel.
- ★ Overlooking the Narmada River and the Sardar Sarovar Dam (the second largest gravity dam worldwide by concrete volume), the statue is situated on Sadhu Bet hillock.












★ In 2020 India's Statue of Unity was included in the list of eight wonders of the <u>Shanghai Cooperation</u> <u>Organisation (SCO)</u>.



# **Uttarakhand Eases Marriage Rules for Foreigners**

# Why in News?

The Uttarakhand government has approved an important amendment to the <u>Uniform Civil Code (UCC)</u>, which now allows citizens of Nepali, Bhutanese, and Tibetan origin residing in the state to register their marriages, even if they do not have an <u>Aadhaar card</u>.

## **Key Points**

- Eligibility: Citizens from Nepal, Bhutan, and Tibet can now register their marriages using alternative identity documents, such as a Citizenship Certificate, Residence Certificate, Passport, or Valid Identity Card.
  - ★ In cases where citizens from these countries are already married or about to marry, they can register their marriages by uploading these documents.
- Objective of the Amendment: The amendment aims to accommodate foreign citizens, especially from Nepal, Bhutan, and Tibet, who have deep historical and cultural ties with Uttarakhand.
  - ★ These regions share an international border with Uttarakhand and have longstanding residence, relationships, and marriage connections with the state.
  - ★ The state recognises the importance of integrating these citizens into the social justice system and ensuring they are not excluded from legal processes such as marriage registration.
- Key Provisions of UCC in Uttarakhand:
  - ★ The UCC, passed in February 2024, excluded tribal communities from its provisions.
  - The UCC prohibits certain practices like **Halala, Iddat and Talaq** (customs related to marriage and divorce in Muslim Personal Law).



- ★ Under the UCC, marriage and divorce registrations are mandatory, with couples who fail to register being denied government benefits.






# India's 1st DNA-Based Elephant Census

# Why in News?

India's first-ever nationwide DNA-based census of wild elephants has revealed a 25% decline in the country's elephant population over the past eight years, highlighting growing threats from habitat loss, fragmentation, and human-elephant conflict.



# **Key Points**

About: The report titled 'Status of Elephants in India: DNA-based Synchronous All-India Population Estimation of Elephants (SAIEE 2021–25)' estimated 22,446 elephants, compared to 29,964 in 2017.













- ★ The exercise was conducted by the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) under Project Elephant (1992).
- ★ The study marks a shift from visual and dungbased counts to a DNA mark-recapture technique, enabling more scientifically accurate population estimation.
- ★ The DNA-based method, similar to that used in tiger estimation, identifies individual elephants through unique genetic markers, overcoming the limitation of elephants' lack of distinctive physical features.

#### Data Collection:

- ★ Conducted across 188,030 trails covering 6.66 lakh km.
- ★ Over 3.19 lakh dung plots examined and 21,056 samples collected.
- ★ DNA profiles generated for 4,065 individual elephants.
- Estimation Technique: Used Spatially Explicit Capture–Recapture (SECR) models integrating genetic and habitat data for accurate population estimation.

# Regional Distribution:

- ★ Karnataka 6,013
- ★ Assam 4,159
- ★ Tamil Nadu 3,136
- ★ Kerala 2,785
- ★ Uttarakhand 1,792
- ★ Odisha 912

# Regional Trends:

- ★ Western Ghats: 11,934 elephants (down from 14,587 in 2017)
- Northeastern Hills & Brahmaputra Plains: 6,559 (down from 10,139)
- ★ Central Indian Highlands & Eastern Ghats: 1,891 (down from 3,128)
- ★ Shivalik-Gangetic Plains: 2,062 (nearly unchanged from 2,085)

## Key Insights:

- ★ Habitat Fragmentation: Expansion of coffee and tea plantations, farmland fencing, and infrastructure projects are fragmenting elephant habitats, especially in the Western Ghats.
- Human-Elephant Conflict: Highest in Assam (Sonitpur, Golaghat) and central India (Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Odisha).

- Central India, with less than 10% of elephants, accounts for 45% of human deaths caused by elephants.
- ★ Positive Development: Poaching incidents have declined, but habitat degradation remains the major threat.

# Uttarakhand to Levy Green Tax

# Why in News?

The **Uttarakhand government** will begin collecting a <u>Green Tax</u> from vehicles entering the state from other states starting December 2025.

## **Key Points**

- Objective: The decision aims to control vehicular pollution, protect the fragile Himalayan ecosystem, and promote environmental cleanliness across the state.
- System and Technology: The automated tax collection system will use Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras installed at the state's entry points to capture the registration numbers of incoming vehicles.
  - ★ The captured data will be transmitted to the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) database, where, after verification, the applicable tax amount will be automatically deducted from the vehicle owner's payment wallet and credited to the transport department's account.
- Exemption: Vehicles registered in Uttarakhand, government, electric and <u>CNG vehicles</u>, ambulances, fire brigade trucks, and two-wheelers will be exempt from the green tax, while vehicles re-entering the state within 24 hours will also not be charged again.

#### **Green Tax**

- "Green tax" is a financial levy imposed by governments on vehicles or sources that contribute to environmental pollution, particularly <u>air</u> <u>pollution</u> from vehicular emissions.
- The tax serves **both as a deterrent** to excessive polluting vehicle use and as a revenue source for ecological initiatives.
