- 1. With reference to Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT), consider the following statements:
  - 1. Its jurisdiction extends to the all-India services, the Central civil services and the officers of the Supreme Court.
  - 2. The aggrieved public servant can approach the Supreme Court directly against an order of the CAT.

Which of the statements given above is/are correct?

- (a) 1 only
- (b) 2 only
- (c) Both 1 and 2
- (d) Neither 1 nor 2

# Answer: (d) Explanation:

- The jurisdiction of the Central Administrative Tribunal extends to the all-India services, the Central civil services, civil posts under the Centre and civilian employees of defence services.
- However, the members of the defence forces, officers and servants of the Supreme Court and the secretarial staff of the Parliament are not covered by it. **Hence, Statement 1 is not correct.**
- Originally, appeals against the orders of the CAT could be made only in the Supreme Court and not in the high courts.
- However, in the Chandra Kumar case (1997), the Supreme Court laid down that appeals against the orders of the CAT shall lie before the division bench of the concerned high court. **Hence, Statement 2 is not correct.**
- 2. In the context of Long Term Repo Operations (LTRO), consider the following statements:
  - 1. RBI will conduct term repos of one-year and two-year tenors under LTRO.
  - 2. Total funds to be injected is up to Rs 10,00,000 crores.
  - 3. Interest rate will be at the prevailing policy repo rate.

Which of the statements given above is/are correct?

- (a) 1 only
- (b) 1 and 2 only
- (c) 3 only
- (d) 1, 2 and 3 only

# Answer: (c) Explanation:

• Under Long Term Repo Operations, RBI will conduct term **repos of oneyear and three-year tenors** of appropriate sizes for up to a total **amount** 





### of Rs 1 lakh crore at the policy repo rate. Hence, Option (c) is correct.

- 3. Consider the following statements regarding the Law Commission of India:
  - 1. The Law Commission of India is a non-statutory body constituted by the Government of India.
  - 2. The Commission is reconstituted every five years.
  - 3. It works as an advisory body to the Ministry of Law and Justice.

Which of the statements given above is/are correct?

- (a) 1 only
- (b) 1 and 3 only
- (c) 2 and 3 only
- (d) 1, 2 and 3 only

# Answer: (b) Explanation:

- The Law Commission of India is an **executive**, **non-statutory body** and **non-permanent** established by the Government of India from time to time. **Hence**, **Statement 1 is correct**.
- The Commission was **originally constituted in 1955** and is reconstituted every three years. Hence, Statement 2 is not correct.
- It works as an advisory body to the Ministry of Law and Justice. Hence, Statement 3 is correct.
- 4. Which of the following statements is/are correct regarding Marginal Standing Facility?
  - 1. Marginal standing facility is a window for banks to borrow from the Reserve Bank of India in an emergency situation when interbank liquidity dries up completely.
  - 2. Banks borrow from the central bank by pledging government securities at a rate lower than the repo rate.

Choose the correct answer from the code given below:

- (a) 1 only
- (b) 2 only
- (c) Both 1 and 2
- (d) Neither 1 nor 2

# Answer: (a) Explanation:

- Marginal standing facility is a window for banks to borrow from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in an emergency situation when interbank liquidity dries up completely. **Hence, Statement 1 is correct.**
- It is a penal rate at which banks can borrow money from the RBI when





- they are completely exhausted of all borrowing assistance.
- The Marginal Standing facility allows banks to borrow money with an interest rate **above the repo rate** and can be termed as the Marginal standing facility rate. **Hence, Statement 2 is not correct.**
- 5. Regarding the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST), which of the following statements is incorrect?
  - (a) The National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) consists of a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson and 3 other Members.
  - (b) At least one member should be a woman.
  - (c) The members hold office for a term of 5 years.
  - (d) The members are not eligible for appointment for more than two terms.

# Answer: (c) Explanation:

- The National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) consists of a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson and 3 other Members who are appointed by the President by warrant under his hand and seal.
- At least one member should be a woman.
- The Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson and the other Members hold office for a term of 3 years.
- The members are not eligible for appointment for more than two terms. Hence, Option (c) is correct.
- 6. Consider the following statements about Research and Development in India:
  - 1. India's investment in R&D has shown a consistent increasing trend over the years.
  - 2. NITI Aayog has proposed a Research and Development(R&D) fund to stimulate investment in R&D.

Which of the statements given above is/are correct?

- (a) 1 only
- (b) 2 only
- (c) Both 1 and 2
- (d) Neither 1 nor 2

# Answer: (a) Explanation:

- According to a 2019 report by the Economic Advisory Council (EAC), India's investment in R&D has shown a consistent increasing trend over the years.
  - o However, it is still a fraction of India's GDP as it has remained





constant at around 0.6% to 0.7% of India's GDP. **Hence**, **Statement 1 is correct.** 

- The Department of Science and Technology is planning a Research and Development(R&D) fund to stimulate investment in R&D. Hence, statement 2 is not correct.
- 7. Which of the following states has never come under the President's rule in India?
  - 1. Telangana
  - 2. Uttarakhand
  - 3. Chhattisgarh
  - 4. Himachal Pradesh

Select the correct code:

- (a) 1 only
- (b) 1 and 2 only
- (c) 1 and 3 only
- (d) 1, 3 and 4 only

Answer: (c) Explanation:

Chhattisgarh and Telangana are the only states where the president's rule has not been imposed so far.

- 8. Consider the following statements regarding the Aditya-L1 Mission:
  - 1. It would be placed into a point in space known as the L1 Lagrange point.
  - 2. It will be ISRO's first space-based astronomy mission.
  - 3. It is meant to observe only the solar corona.

Which of the statements given above is/are correct?

- (a) 1 only

- (d) 1, 2 and 3

Answer: (a) Explanation:

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is preparing for its first scientific expedition to study the Sun, Aditya-L1.

- It would be placed into a point in space known as the **L1 Lagrange** point. Hence, Statement 1 is correct.
- **Objectives:** Aditya L1 will study
  - The Sun's corona (Visible and Near infrared rays)
  - Sun's **photosphere** (soft and hard X-ray)





- Chromosphere (Ultra Violet)
- o Solar emissions,
- Solar winds and flares,
- Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs)

#### Hence, Statement 2 is not correct.

Aditya L1 will be ISRO's **2nd space-based astronomy mission after AstroSat**, which was launched in 2015. **Hence, Statement 3 is not correct.** 

- 9. The word 'Cyrtodactylus' sometimes mentioned in media in reference to

#### Answer: (c)

#### **Explanation:**

A new species of lizard, the urban bent-toed gecko (Cyrtodactylus urbanus) was discovered in Guwahati, Assam.

#### Answer: (a)

#### **Explanation:**

Worldwide Education for Future Index is published by The Economist Intelligence Unit. **Hence, Option (a) is correct.**

# Answer: (b) Explanation:

- Shyama Prasad Mukherji Rurban Mission(SPMRM) is a scheme launched by the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) in 2016. Hence, Statement 1 is not correct.
- The scheme aims to deliver integrated project based infrastructure in the rural areas to bridge the rural-urban divide. Hence, Statement 2 is correct.
- The scheme also aims to include the development of economic activities and skill development.
- 14. With reference to 'Korku Tribe', consider the following statements:
  - 1. The Korku are primarily cultivators.
  - 2. The Korku regard their dead as Gods.

Which of the statements given above is/are correct?

# Answer: (c) Explanation:

- The Korku mostly reside in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, and adjoining Melghat region of Maharashtra.
- The Korku are primarily cultivators. **Hence, Statement 1 is correct.**
- Korku is one of the 196 languages termed endangered by UNESCO.
  - o It is closely associated with the Munda family language.
- A few groups have been more successful in preserving their language, especially the Potharia Korku (from the Vindhya mountains).
- The community has a distinct cultural heritage. The traditional healing methods are still widely practiced among them.
- The Korku regard their dead as Gods. To commemorate the dead they install a memorial pillar which is called Munda. **Hence, Statement 2 is correct.**

- This corridor will also pass through Dadri, which is the origin point of the Western Dedicated Freight Corridor and which will serve as a junction. **Hence, Statement 3 is not correct.**

  - 1. The four species of bustards in India have all suffered continuous population decline.
  - 2. Indian vultures have experienced catastrophics population declines starting in the early 1990's.

- State of India's Birds 2020 is an assessment of the long-term trend, current trend, distribution range size, and the overall conservation status of 867 Indian bird species.
- The four species of bustards in India have all suffered continuous population decline. Four species of bustards are:
  - Great Indian Bustard
  - o Macqueen's Bustard
  - Lesser Florican
  - Bengal Florican

#### Hence, Statement 1 is correct.

- The report points out that the Indian vultures have experienced catastrophics population declines starting in the early 1990's.
  - The decline is mostly attributed to inadvertent poisoning by the livestock anti-inflammatory drug diclofenac.

#### Hence, Statement 2 is correct.

- It is a part of the upper Vindhyan hills. **Hence, Statement 2 is not correct.**
