



## GENERAL STUDIES

General studies papers I and paper II will cover the following areas of knowledge:-

### 02. GENERAL STUDIES PAPER- I

1. Modern History of India and Indian culture.
  2. Current events of national and international importance.
  3. Statistical analysis, graphs and diagrams.
- In paper-I, Modern History of India and Indian Culture will cover the broad history of the country (with special reference to Bihar) from about the middle of nineteenth century.
  - The modern history of Bihar will include questions on the introduction and expansion of western education (including technical education).
  - It will also have questions on Bihar's role in the freedom struggle of India.
  - Questions will relate to the Santhal Uprising, 1857 in Bihar, Birsa movement, Champaran Satyagrah and the Quit India Movement 1942.
  - A knowledge of the chief features of Mauryan and Pal art and Patna Kalam painting will be expected from the examinees.
  - It would also include questions on Gandhi, Tagore and Nehru.
  - The part relating to statistical analysis, graphs and diagrams will include exercises to test the candidate's ability to draw common sense conclusions from information presented in statistical, graphical or diagrammatic form and to point out deficiencies, limitations or inconsistencies therein.

### 03. GENERAL STUDIES PAPER- II

1. Indian Polity
  2. Indian economy and Geography of India
  3. The role and impact of science and technology in the development of India.
- In Paper II, the part relating to Indian Polity, will include questions on the political system in India including Bihar.
  - In the part pertaining to the Indian Economy and Geography of India, questions will be put on planning in India and the physical, economic and social geography of India and Bihar.
  - In the third part relating to the role and impact of science and technology in the development of India, questions will be asked to test the candidate's awareness of the role and impact of science and technology in India and Bihar. Emphasis will be on applied aspects.

### 04. Optional Paper III

- There will be only one optional subject exam for 100 marks and the questions will be MCQ based. It will be qualifying in nature. It will be mandatory to obtain minimum qualifying marks of 40% for general candidates, 36.5% for Backward classes, 34% for Extremely Backward classes and 32% for SC/ST, Women and Disabled candidates.
  - These marks are not added to the merit list.
  - The candidates have to select one optional subject out of subjects mentioned in notification.
- The choices are given below and the syllabus for optional subjects can be viewed in the BPSC Syllabus PDF.
  - Optional Subjects in BPSC Syllabus are:
    - English Language and Literature, Urdu Language and Literature, Hindi Language and Literature, Persian Language and Literature, Arabic Language and Literature, Pali Language and Literature, Maithili Language and Literature, Bangla Language and Literature, Sanskrit Language and Literature, Chemistry, Sociology, Physics, Agriculture, Statistics, Botany, Zoology, Philosophy, Political, Science and International Relations, Psychology, Public Administration, Labour and Social Welfare, Management, Mathematics, Mechanical

Engineering, Geography , Geology, History, Law, Civil Engineering, Economics, Commerce and Accountancy, Electrical Engineering, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Science, Anthropology.
