

# **Right to Education**



#### What is it?

☐ Free and compulsory education to children in the age group of 6-14 years.

## Constitutional Background

- □ Original Constitution
  - O Article 45
  - O Article 39(f)
- □ Ramamurti Committee Report in 1990.
- Unnikrishnan JP vs State of Andhra Pradesh & Others held that Education is a Fundamental right flowing from Article 21.
- □ Tapas Majumdar Committee (1999).
- ☐ The 86<sup>th</sup> amendment to the constitution of India in 2002.
  - O Education as a fundamental right
  - O Insertion of Article 21A
  - O Education for children between 6-14 age
- ☐ Right to Education Act 2009.

#### **Features**

- Primary education to all children aged 6 to 14 years.
- □ 25% reservation for disadvantaged sections.
- □ Non-admitted child to be admitted to an age appropriate class.
- □ It lays down the norms and standards related to:
  - O Pupil Teacher Ratios (PTRs)
  - O Buildings and infrastructure
  - O School-working days
  - O Teacher-working hours
- □ It prohibits:

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- Physical punishment and mental harassment
- Screening procedures for admission of children
- Capitation fee
- Private tuition by teachers
- O Running of schools without recognition

# Achievements

- ☐ Increased enrolment in the upper primary level.
- ☐ Improved school infrastructure, especially in rural areas.
- ☐ More than 3.3 million students secured admission under 25% quota norm.
- Made education inclusive and accessible nationwide.
- ☐ Brought accountability in the elementary education system.

## **Limitations**

- □ Only 6-14 years age children included instead of 0-18 years.
- ☐ No focus on quality of learning.
- ☐ Majorly input oriented.
- ☐ More focus over statistics of RTE.
- Lack of teachers affects pupil-teacher ratio mandated by RTE.

## Steps to be taken

- ☐ Minority Religious Schools to be brought under the RTE.
- ☐ More focus on teacher training programs.
- Quality of education needs to be improved than quantity.
- ☐ Make the teaching profession attractive.

- ☐ Creation of a conducive socio economic atmosphere
- ☐ Supply of required resources at the right time and right place.





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
