



Nelloptodes Getae

Scientists at the Natural History Museum in London have officially named a tiny species of beetle *Nelloptodes getae*. It has been named after the 16-year-old Swedish environmental campaigner [Greta](#)



[Thunberg](#).

- *N. getae* was **first found in Kenya in the 1960s** which was later donated to the Natural History Museum in London in 1978.
- Biological names comprise two words, one for the genus and the second for the species.
 - While the species name *getae* derives from Greta, the genus *Nelloptodes* too is new.

Key Points

- The arthropod, which has no eyes or wings, is **less than 1mm long and belongs to the Ptiliidae family**, which is made up of some of the world's smallest beetles.
- Biodiversity loss has led to the **faster extinction of the undiscovered species**. The naming signifies Greta's contribution in raising awareness of environmental issues.
- A parasite named after Bob Marley (*Gnathia marleyi*), a genus of fish called after Richard Dawkins (*Dawkinsia*), a spider called *Spintharus leonardodicaprio* after Leonardo DiCaprio are some other species named after famous personalities.
