In pursuit of reducing the pollution in River Ganga, the government of India has launched the flagship program called Namami Gange. The program envisages a holistic approach to public policy, technology intervention, and community participation.

Body

Role Played by Namami Gange Project

- Cooperative Federalism: The Namami Gange Yojana is implemented by the National Mission for Clean Ganga along with its State Programme Management Groups (SPMGs).
- Mains Pillars: The main pillars of the Namami Gange can be depicted as the following:
 - Sewerage Treatment Infrastructure & Industrial Effluent Monitoring.
 - Development of river-front as well as river-surface cleaning.
 - Bio-Diversity & Afforestation.
 - Public Awareness.
- **Public Policy:** Under the Namami Gange project, the government issued a notification to authorize the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) to exercise powers under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
 - Due to this, the NMCG also issued directives regulating mining activities on river banks, prohibiting encroachment, and regulating activities like the immersion of idols.
- Technology Intervention: NMCG adopted cutting-edge technologies like satellite imagery, remote sensing, and geospatial solutions which facilitated real-time monitoring of pollutants in Ganga and its tributaries.
- Community Participation: Namami Gange also encourages community participation in cleaning the river.
 - It runs an awareness campaign regularly carried out in cities, towns, and villages alongside Ganga through a newly-established community force called "Ganga Praharis".

• Through them, the government seeks to transform "jal chetna" into "jan chetna" and turn it into a "jal aandolan".
