

Cheetah Cubs in Kuno National Park


Why in News?

According to the Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, a Namibian cheetah named Aasha has given birth to three cubs in <u>Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park.</u>

This development is termed as "a roaring success for <u>Project Cheetah</u>".

Key Points

- Kuno National Park which is located in Madhya Pradesh's Sheopur district is home to several cheetahs translocated from Namibia and South Africa.
- Project Cheetah in India formally commenced on September 17, 2022, to restore the population of cheetahs, which were declared extinct in the country in 1952.
- Government of India has started many <u>Wildlife conservation</u> projects such as:
 - Project Tiger
 - Project Elephant
 - Project Rhinoceros
 - Project Crocodile Conservation
 - Project Vulture
 - Project Red Panda
 - Project Gangetic River Dolphin
