  - It forced Germany to cede its territory to Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Poland, and return Alsace and Lorraine to France.

#### Formation of the League of Nations:

• The treaty established the League of Nations, an international organization aimed at preventing future wars through collective security and disarmament.

#### German Humiliation:

- The treaty imposed harsh terms on Germany, including the acceptance of full responsibility for causing the war, payment of massive reparations, and severe restrictions on its military and economic power.
- It called for Kaiser Wilhelm II, ruler of Germany, to stand trial for war crimes.
- Above all, it included the "war guilt clause" which held Germany solely responsible for starting the war and required it to pay reparations for Allied war losses.

#### • Rise of Nationalism:

- The treaty not only created a sense of nationalism and pride among the newly formed states, but also fueled resentment and a desire for revenge among the defeated powers.
- This led to resentment and bitterness among the German people, setting the stage for the rise of Adolf Hitler and the Nazi Party.

#### Demilitarization:

• Germany was forced to drastically reduce its armed forces to weaken its defence.

Overall, the Treaty of Versailles had a significant impact on shaping the post-World War I world order. The treaty was created more through fear and anger than forgiveness, compassion and a desire for rebuilding relationships and ensuring long lasting peace.
