

Visit of Indian Naval Ships to Malaysia

Recently, Indian Naval ships, **INS Delhi** and **INS Shakti,** visited Kota Kinabalu, Malaysia as part of the Indian Navy's Operational Deployment. The visit aims to strengthen the friendship and cooperation between India and Malaysia through a series of engagements and activities.

- The Indian Navy ships will participate in a <u>Maritime Partnership Exercise (MPX)/ PASSEX</u> at sea with ships of the Royal Malaysian Navy to **enhance interoperability** between the two Navies.
 - INS Delhi is the first indigenously designed and built <u>Project-15 class</u> guided missile destroyer, while INS Shakti is a Fleet Support Ship, both part of the <u>Indian Navy's Eastern</u> Fleet.
- India-Malaysia Relations:
 - Surrounded by busy sea lines of communications such as the <u>Strait of Malacca</u> and the <u>South China Sea</u>, Malaysia is a key pillar of <u>India's Act East policy</u> and critical to <u>India's maritime connectivity strategies</u>.
 - India and Malaysia have signed the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA). CECA is a kind of Free Trade Agreement (FTA).
 - Joint defence exercises between India and Malaysia:
 - Army: Exercise Harimau Shakti
 - Airforce: Exercise Udarashakti
 - Navy: Exercise Samudra Laksamana
