Introduction

Vision The food processing industry plays a pivotal role in transforming India's agricultural economy. As a sunrise sector, it enables value addition, reduces wastage, and supports farmers and rural enterprises, making it a powerful engine for economic growth and employment generation.

Body

Reducing Post-Harvest Losses:

- Development of cold chains, processing units, and preservation infrastructure under schemes like **PMKSY** has significantly reduced agri-waste.
- NABCON evaluation found waste reduction of up to 70% in fisheries and 85% in dairy
- 1087 operational PMKSY projects have created a processing capacity of 241.94 lakh MT, preserving perishable produce and minimizing loss.
- 50 irradiation projects and 100 new food testing labs are being supported to improve shelf life and safety.

Enhancing Farmers' Income:

- PMKSY has benefited around 51 lakh farmers by creating market linkages and ensuring better
- Processed food exports increased to 23.4% of agri-exports in 2023-24, reflecting higher value
- One District One Product (ODOP) under PM Formalisation of Micro food processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme empowers local producers and adds value to traditional agriproducts.
- Rs. 254 crore seed capital sanctioned in 2024 under PMFME to support SHG-led enterprises.

Generating Employment Opportunities:

- Food processing contributes **12.41% of employment** in the organized manufacturing sector (ASI 2022-23).
- PMKSY has created **7.46 lakh jobs** (direct/indirect) through 1646 approved projects.
- PLISFPI Scheme attracted ₹8910 crore investment and generated 2.89 lakh jobs across highgrowth food segments.
- **46,643 loans** sanctioned under PMFME in 2024 alone, supporting micro enterprises and rural entrepreneurship.
- The Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) supports Self-Help Groups (SHGs) through schemes like PMFME, providing seed capital up to ₹40,000 per member and a credit-linked grant of up to ₹10 lakh.
 - SHGs are also eligible for assistance under **PMKSY**, enhancing their role in rural economic growth.

Conclusion

With strong policy support, rising investments, and expanding infrastructure, the food processing sector can reduce agri-waste, boost farmer incomes, and create off-farm employment, advancing rural development, economic growth, and SDG 2 (Zero Hunger). Leveraging technology like AI in supply chain management can further enhance efficiency, sustainability, and food security.
