

COP 10 (2010) – Nagoya, Japan

COP 11 (2012) - Hyderabad, India

COP 14 (2018) - Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt

COP 15 (2021-22) – Phase I → Kunming (China); Phase II → Montreal (Canada)

- Kunming Biodiversity Fund proposed
- · Adopted Post 2020 Global Biodiversity Framework
- 30 by 30 Target Restore 30% of ecosystems, lands, oceans, coasts by 2030
