

MacGregor Memorial Medal

Five military personnel were conferred the <u>MacGregor Memorial Medal</u> by <u>Chief of Defence Staff</u> for their outstanding contributions in <u>military reconnaissance</u>, exploration, and adventure for 2023 and 2024.

- History: The award was instituted on 3rd July 1888, to honor Major General Sir Charles
 Metcalfe MacGregor, the founder of the United Service Institution of India (USI) in 1870.
 - USI is a national security and defense services think tank based in New Delhi.
- About Award: Initially awarded for military reconnaissance and exploration, the medal's scope expanded post-1947 to include adventure activities like mountaineering, sailing, and ultra-running.
 - It is open to all ranks of the <u>Indian Army</u>, <u>Navy</u>, <u>Air Force</u>, <u>Territorial Army</u>, <u>Reserve Forces</u>, Rashtriya Rifles, and <u>Assam Rifles</u>.
- Charles Metcalfe: He was a British officer and explorer. He contributed to the Anglo-Bhutan War (1864-1865) by surveying and mapping frontier regions, gathering intelligence, and strengthening British knowledge about the difficult Himalayan terrain.
