Why in News?

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan commemorated the **65th Foundation Day of NCERT** by launching multiple initiatives.

He urged the institution to adopt a reform-oriented and technology-driven approach to education.

Key Initiatives Launched

- PM eVidya Mobile Application: It is a centralized gateway for accessing all key digital and broadcast initiatives under PM eVidya, developed in collaboration with BISAG-N.
- **DIKSHA 2.0**: It has structured lessons, adaptive assessments, performance feedback, discussion forums, and All tools like Read Aloud, Closed Caption, and Translation of text files into 12 languages.
- PRASHAST 2.0: It is a Pre-Assessment Holistic Screening Tool that enhances mobile and web platforms for early identification of children with disabilities.
- Kitab Ek Padhe Anek: It is an <u>NEP-2020</u>-aligned initiative to create Universal Design of Learning (UDL)-based accessible digital and printed textbooks for inclusive classrooms, especially benefiting <u>Divyangian students</u> and children from socio-economically disadvantaged groups.
- Utkal Jananinkara Sujogya Santana: It is a book containing the life and contributions of 100 great personalities of Odisha who have contributed to the development of modern Odisha and also participated in the National Freedom Movement.
