


Birth Anniversary of Ramdhari Singh Dinkar

Why in News?

- Role in India's Freedom Struggle: Dinkar's poetry, especially his fiery verses in Veer Rasa (the emotion of bravery), played a pivotal role in igniting a nationalist spirit during India's struggle for independence.
- **Political and Academic Engagement**: Dinkar made significant contributions to both politics and academia, serving as a **Rajya Sabha** member from 1952 to 1964.
 - He also served as **Vice-Chancellor** of Bhagalpur University in the 1960s, reinforcing his influence in the academic sphere.
- Recognition and Honour: In 1959, Dinkar was honoured with the <u>Padma Bhushan</u> for his exceptional contributions to literature, solidifying his place as one of <u>India's greatest literary figures</u>.

- Renowned as a **Rashtrakavi (national poet),** Dinkar earned recognition for his patriotic and inspiring compositions that captured the essence of his era.
- In 1999, Dinkar was featured among prominent Hindi writers on a series of commemorative postal stamps released by the Government of India, marking 50 years since Hindi became the official language.
- On 22nd May 2015, Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the golden jubilee celebrations of Dinkar's significant works, Sanskriti ke Chaar Adhyaye and Parshuram ki Pratiksha, at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi.
